

COMMON ORDINANCE FOR FIVE YEAR INTEGRATED COURSES

{Unless otherwise specified, this Ordinance is applicable to all five year Integrated courses (semester system)}

1. The duration of the course shall be five academic years, divided into ten semesters. The examination for the I, III, V, VII and IX semesters shall ordinarily be held in the month of December/January and for the II, IV, VI, VIII and X semesters, in the month of May/June on such dates as may be notified by the Controller of Examinations.

A Supplementary examination for odd and even semesters shall be held alongwith their regular odd and even semester examinations. However, the supplementary examination for V, VI and IX, X semesters shall be held simultaneously after every six months.

2. **(i) After completion of first six semesters** i.e. three academic years the candidates may be awarded the Bachelor's Degree in Hons. (subject name) (Five year Integrated programme).

(ii) After completion of last four semesters (seventh to Tenth semesters), the candidates may be awarded the Master's degree in Hons. (Subject name) (Five year integrated programme).

(iii) In B.A.LL.B. (Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) 5 year course, the exit is not allowed by the Bar Council of India. Hence, the degree of B.A.LL.B. (Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) only shall be awarded after the completion of the 5 year course.

3. The examination schedule containing the dates of receipt of examination forms with and without late fee shall be notified by the Controller of Examinations from time to time.
4. A person who has passed the 10+2 examination from Haryana Board or any other examination recognized by the M.D.University, Rohtak as equivalent thereto, shall be eligible for admission. The detailed eligibility conditions e.g. percentage of marks in the qualifying examinations, subject (s) combination etc. etc. shall be notified in the Admission Brochure as approved by the Academic Council from time to time.

Candidates placed under compartment in the qualifying examination shall not be eligible for admission.

Those who have done graduation or post graduation shall not be eligible for 5 year Integrated Courses.

Note:

The candidate admitted to B.A.LL.B.(Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) 5 year course shall not be allowed to switch over to any other course, otherwise the candidature for B.A.LL.B.(Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) course shall be cancelled forthwith.

5. The minimum pass marks for passing any examinations shall be as under:
 - (i) 40% in each theory paper
 - (ii) 40% in each practical examination or viva-voce/project/training report/dissertation wherever prescribed.
 - (iii) 40% in aggregate of each theory paper and internal assessment (and practical where practical is a component of theory paper).
6. Every candidate shall be examined in the subject(s) as laid down in the syllabus and scheme of examination prescribed by the Academic Council from time to time. The fail/re-appear candidates will also appear in the examination as per syllabus applicable to regular students of that semester.

7. 20% marks in each written paper (excluding viva-voce), shall be assigned for internal assessment.
The Head of the Department shall forward the internal assessment marks awarded by the concerned teacher on the basis of class test, written assignment and its Presentation/Seminar and attendance in the classes etc. to the Controller of Examinations as per the following schedule:
- (i) The Internal Assessment/Sessionals marks should be supplied by the Heads of the Departments invariably **within 20 days after commencement of the examination.**
 - (ii) Thereafter, a late fee @ Rs.25/- per candidate per subject shall be charged from the Department.
 - (iii) No internal Assessment/Sessionals marks shall be entertained if the same are received in the University after 30 days of the declaration of results. However, vice-Chancellor may condone the delay with late fee after taking into consideration the merit of each case.
8. The Head of the Institution/Department will preserve the records on the basis of which the Internal Assessment awards have been prepared for inspection, if needed by the University, up to three months of the date of declaration of each semester examination results.
9. The candidate will be allowed to appear in the examinations if he/she meets the following requirements:-
- a) bears a good character
 - b) has been on the rolls of the Department during the semester.
 - c) has attended not less than 65% {70% for B.A.LL.B.(Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) course} of lectures delivered in theory as well as practicals. Relaxation in shortage of lectures upto 20% will be allowed by the Head of the Department on the following grounds:
 - (i) self-illness;
 - (ii) illness/death of parents, brother, sister or any other close family member;
 - (iii) Any other reason beyond the control of the student to the satisfaction of the Head of the Department.
10. The medium of instruction and the examination shall be Hindi/English. For B.A.LL.B.(Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.), the medium of instructions shall be English. However, the medium of examination shall be English/Hindi. Question paper however, will be supplied in English only.
11. The examination fee to be paid by the candidate for each semester shall be prescribed by the University from time to time.
12. The candidate shall be treated as promoted to the next semester/class automatically subject to fulfilment of conditions as laid down in clause-9 of the Ordinance.
However, promotion to 7th semester will be allowed only when he/she has cleared the 1st module(1st to 6th semesters).
13. For the purpose of promotion, each theory and practical in any subject shall be considered as separate paper.
14. A candidate who fails to pass or having been eligible, fails to appear in any semester examination will be allowed to clear the re-appear paper(s) and also for improvement of result after passing a semester examination within a period of Eight (8) years.
While re-appearing to pass a semester examination, the candidate will be exempted from

reappearing in the papers/practicals in which he/she secured 40% pass marks.

15. The Internal Assessment awards as well as viva-voce awards of a candidate who fails in any semester examination shall be carried forward to the next examination.
16. Soon after the termination of the examination, the Controller of Examinations shall declare the result as early as possible.
17. The list of successful candidates after the VI and X semester (10th semester for B.A.LL.B.(Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) 5 year courses) examination shall be arranged as under in three divisions on the basis of the aggregate marks obtained in I to VI and I to X semester examinations taken together, and the division obtained by the candidate will be stated in his/her degree:-
 - a) those who obtain 60% or more marks First Division
 - b) those who obtain 50% or more marks but Second Division
 less than that 60% marks
 - c) Those who obtain less than 50% marks Third Division
18. After passing each semester examination, a candidate will be allowed to appear for improvement of result in one or more theory papers only once within the period prescribed in clause-13 (i). Only improved marks (higher score) will be taken into account. The candidate will have to appear according to the current syllabus.

Note:

Improvement in law subjects of B.A.LL.B.(Hons.)/B.B.A.LL.B. (Hons.) course is not allowed. However, improvement in pre-law subjects only is allowed in these courses.

19. The grace marks will be allowed as per University rules.
20. The Training Report/Field Report/ Project Report/Moot courts etc. wherever prescribed in the syllabus/scheme of examination and required to be submitted to the University must reach in the concerned office within 20 days after the commencement of the theory examinations.
