The Directorate is presently offering ten popular Undergraduate/Postgraduate programmes i.e. Bachelor of Arts (B.A.), Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com.), Master of Arts (Hindi, English, Sanskrit, Economics, Political Science, Public Admn.), Master of Science (Mathematics), Master of Commerce (M.Com.) for Distance learners based on carefully designed curriculum, well planned teaching learning strategies, effective student support system for an effective functioning and fair examination and valuation system.

The DDE is providing full support and service to its students, ensuring removal of difficulties at personal level so that the participation of the students in the programmes offered by the DDE becomes really effective and meaningful.

The Directorate has evolved the concept of "**Students Support Services Camps** (**SSSCs**)" to help and groom the distance learners in several ways. Student Support Service in open and distance learning system is quite different from other services. These services are not only confined to interactive counselling or solving the learner's problems but also include to promote distance learning to address the issue of continuous upgradation of skills so as to produce manpower resources of the kind and the number required by society, to fulfill the expectations indicated in the National Education policy (1986). In addition to the services already mentioned, the focus of the educators is also on learners' personality development, inculcating soft-skills, career counselling & guidance and community education. Further, the SSSCs are aimed to facilitate learning, counselling and to solve the problems of the distance learners. Through SSSCs the learners get an opportunity to interact with the counsellors and the peer group.

UNIVERSITY LIBRARY

Librarian : Dr. Satish Malik

Vivekananda Library is a central facility, which caters to the informational requirements of the students, teachers, research scholars, and other staff of the University located at Rohtak and other parts of the State of Haryana. Library collections are maintained in Vivekananda Library, five satellite libraries -IHTM Library, IMSAR Library, Law Library, Maths Library, UIET Library – and some other departmental libraries.

Library Committee

Library Committee – the policy making body of the library, after considering the proposals of the University Librarian concerning the needs of the library for more effective use and development of the resources thereof, decides the guidelines for smooth functioning of the Library. The Committee has Vice-Chancellor as its Chairman and University Librarian as its Member-Secretary. All the Heads/Directors of Departments/Institutes, and Registrar are its ex-officio members, while two research scholars are nominated on this Committee for a period of two years. Last meeting of the Library Committee was held on November 11, 2018.

Readers' Services

The University Library System comprises a central library named as Vivekananda Library and five satellite libraries –UIET Library, Maths Library, IMSAR Library, Law Library and IHTM Library. Vivekananda Library and its offshoots are essentially meant for the students, research scholars, teaching faculty and other staff of this University, but the library facilities are also extended to some special categories of users, viz., Ph.D. students of other Universities, and Class I Gazetted Officers of the Govt. of Haryana/Govt. of India based at Rohtak. The library, during the year under report had registered 4,794 members, of which 4 were Guest Faculty, 1 Faculty Members, 316 research scholars, 186 M.Phil. Students, 1593 U.G. Students and 2668 P.G. students, 1non-teaching staff and 9 special members. During this period total active members were 7,769. The Visitor Register maintained at the gate of the library recorded a total of 6,81,259 visitors who used the library services during 2018-19.

Library Timings

The Vivekananda Library and Law Library observed the following timings during 2018-19:

Working days, Saturdays &Holidays	8.00 AM to 8.00 PM
Sundays	8.00 AM to 5.00 PM

Besides it, one Reading Hall with capacity of about 250 reading seats opened 24X7 except Holi. The satellite libraries - Management, Engineering, Hotel Management, UIET and Mathematics Libraries opened from 9.00 a.m. – 5.00 p.m. on working days, Saturdays and holidays. The Library observed five holidays only – 26th Jan., Holi, 15th August, 2nd Oct. and Deepawali - during the year.

Library use and Services

i. <u>Circulation Services</u>

Library conducted 1,93,253 circulation transactions. In addition, 5,18,060 volumes were consulted within the library premises. A sum of Rs.6,70,038/- was realized as overdue charged from the defaulting members.

ii. Internet Services

Over 15,250 library users availed of this facility. The Internet Lab opened from 09.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. on working days and Saturdays.

iii. Reading facilities and visitors to libraries

The University Library System provides excellent reading facilities. The Vivekananda Library has air-conditioned reading halls with capacity of 1063 reading seats, and its satellite libraries have another 428 reading seats. One reading hall of Vivekananda Library, with controlled environment and seating capacity of 250, opened 24X7. Over 1,57,927 library users availed this facility during the period under report.

iv. User awareness programmes.

Popularization and promotion of library use is a very important function of any library. Seized of this objective, the Library conducted 27 Library Orientation programmes for print resources and 11 user awareness programmes at department level to equip the users with skills to use e-resources, online catalogue, and other library services.

Technical Services

1. <u>Acquisition of learning resources</u>

During the period under report, 9,888 volumes of books,and 627 theses and dissertations were added to the library collection of the main library and its off-shoots, while 97 books costing Rs.71,373/- were withdrawn on account of realization their costs. 2. <u>Processing of documents (Classification, Cataloguing, spine marking etc.)</u>

The Technical Processing Section processed 9,888 documents, prepared 300 datasheets for data entry and 9,588 books are entered directly in Library Management System (LibSys7). 14,088 books are spine marked and barcoded an equal number of documents during the year under report.

3. Bindery

This Library does not have in-house binding arrangement. All the books and other reading material got bound from an outside agency. A total of 3,933 volumes of books and theses, and 811journals were binded during the year.

4. Journals subscription and total collection

The Library subscribed to 71 foreign journals and 300 Indian journals, and added 814 volumes of bound journals to its collection. The total collection of bound volumes of journals stands at 56,835.

5. <u>e-Resources</u>

Library provided Online Access to 36,478 e-books purchased from the international publishers;7,509 e-journals, including 505 IEEE E-journals, 310Emerald E-journals with content coverage as far back as 1898 (Vol.1 Issue 1), 200 Indian e-journals through the Indian Journals.com portal subscribed by library, complementary access to 37 Sage e-journals, 6.294 e-Journals through e-Shodh Sindhu, and 200 open access E-journals; J-Gate Plus an ejournals' access gateway and database solution provided one point access to 7900+ journals subscribed under e-Shodh Sindhu consortium; Shodhganga- an Indian ETD Repository as its members; SCOPUS - an Elsevier database of abstract and citation from 22,800 Science and Social Science Journals and 1,50,000 books published by 5,000 publishers worldwide; Web of Science - having a broad coverage of 20,000+ quality e-journals selected from the sciences, social sciences, arts, and humanities; Indian Citation Index - a multidisciplinary research platform covering about 1,000 scholarly journals from India; Manupatra – a database of legal documents; four IP based CMIE databases viz., Economic Outlook, Industry Outlook, Prowess and States of India; MLA International Bibliography; DELNET IPC (Pharmaceutical Collection). The Library has taken one step forward to provide access to its users through Remote Access to subscribed contents using Ezproxy - connects library clientele remotely to subscribed electronic resources. Recently, Turnitin & Urkund- similarity check software, are added as a new feather in its cap.

Information Technology Applications

Computerization of library involves the application of ICT to library activities such as acquisition of books, purchase of print books, cataloguing of learning resources, display of new additions, barcoding of books, circulation of books and other reading material, linkage of Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) to the university website, etc. Bibliographic details of all purchased eBooks has been appended to online catalogue which enable its clientele to search through the purchased eBook collection. As of now, all the library operations have been automated using the Libsys7 library management Software. RFID implementation work has been applied to all volumes of books available in the Vivekananda Library.

A hoard of ICT hardware and softwares - 4 servers, 170 PCs, 4 laptops, 7 Information Kiosks, 1 Book Drop with touch screen, 4 scanners, 23 Barcode Readers, 16 UPSs, 33 printers, 12 Network Switches, 20 Head Phones, and 66 Software's (LINUX, LibSys7, MS-Office-2007, Windows 1998, Windows XP (pre-loaded in PCs), etc. – are available in the library for use by the library users and library staff.

UNIVERSITY COMPUTER CENTRE

Director : Dr. G.P. Saroha

University Computer Centre was established by the University with UGC grants under a UGC scheme in 1987. Since its inception, the Computer Centre has been catering to the ICT needs of the University Community.

Keeping pace with the advancing technology, best in class ICT infrastructure has been procured for education, research and e-Governance. University Computer Centre houses a data centre having 16 Blade Servers (Dual CPU – 16 to 24 core, with upto 256 GB RAM on each server) hosting more than 70 Virtual servers. More than 600 TB of unified storage is being used for CCTV surveillance and 25 TB of SAN storage for Student Life Cycle Management. The servers are running on Windows 2012/2016 Server data centre edition in high availability mode. Database server (MS SQL Server 2012 Enterprise Edition and Web Server (MS IIS) uses 10TB IBM SAN Storage. SAP servers with 25TB SAN storage (20,000 IOPs) are all hosted locally. Video Management System Servers with 600 TB of Unified Storage manages 400 video surveillance cameras. Round the clock Comprehensive Security and Surveillance Control Room monitors all these cameras.

A Unified Threat Management Solution has been implemented to secure the network from hackers, for filtering unnecessary traffic, streamlining traffic by specifying priorities, and blocking unwanted sites on the 1G Internet connectivity provided by NKN using FortiGate 1500D, supported by Forti Analyser 1000D. The Internal LAN having backbone speed of 10G is governed by the Nexus 9505 (CISCO) core switch. The university network has more than 15KM Optical Fibre cables, 5000 I/O points and nearly 500 enterprise class secure controller based devices Wi-Fi Access Points.

The University is implementing SAP ERP modules for Student Life cycle Management and e-Governance (Finance and Human Capital Management). Parts of the custom built ERP are still operational and under migration to SAP. In-house development team manages the data centre and develops and deploys solutions for ad-hoc requirements of the university. The new website of the University <u>www.mdu.ac.in</u> has been designed and developed by this team. Other software developed this year by the team include Online admission portal for Foreign students and supernumerary seats in University Teaching Departments, Online admission portal for noncentralised courses, student Portal, Recruitment Panel for Teaching and Non-Teaching Posts, LMS/DMS Portal for e-resources

The University has embraced the use of latest technological advancement in governance system and has already been acknowledged as a front runner in taking egovernance initiatives. Admission process to the various programs of University Teaching Departments and Directorate of Distance Education were made online and to stop admission related malpractices, especially to stop impersonation in the entrance tests, introduction of Biometric attendance in entrance tests has been introduced. To provide and facilitate DIGIDHAN initiative of Government of India, POS have been installed at University Cashier Office and DIGIDHAN Awareness Programs have been organized by the University to make the employees and students aware about digital financial transactions.

To make the University Community aware about use of IT in their day to day office work and to make them aware about information security, Computer Centre conducts short term computer awareness programmes from time to time. One such short term training courses was organized for 39 Apprentices from 11/06/18 to 10/07/18. Another training programme was organized for 26 promoted clerks of the University from 15/01/19 to 30/04/19. Besides this many students from other Universities/Engineering colleges who opt for their internship from this place are provided proper guidance and help.

Computer centre has been assisting various branches of the University in executing their office work. Print order, confidential list and admit cards of more than 10 lakh students were generated by the Computer Centre to help Conduct and Secrecy Branch in conducting the Exams. Help Desk has been established to handle grievances of Colleges and students.

University Computer Centre is handling Administration, Management and provisioning of ICT infrastructure of the University.

University Computer Centre is responsible for procurement, planning and monitoring of ICT infrastructure implementation projects. Currently, three major Projects are under implementation - Unified Communication and Video Conferencing (CISCO), Network Upgradation and Wi-Fi coverage densification (100 additional access points).

UNIVERSITY CENTRE FOR COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS

Director : **Dr. Parmod Bhardwaj** (Additional Charge)

The University Centre for Competitive Examinations (UCCE) has been providing guidance/ coaching to the students since 1990, the year when the centre was established. This centre has been established and funded under the scheme of University Grants Commission, New Delhi. The primary aim of the centre has been to prepare students for entry to various services at state and central level. Though the scheme of UGC is primarily meant for students belonging to SC/ST/Minorities/OBC (non creamy layer), however, poor students belonging to general category may also be admitted.

The centre maintains fully air conditioned library with a seating capacity of 72 students and two lecture theatres. Library contains more than 9000 books. Seven National Newspapers, Journals, Magazines and other useful learning material is available in the library for the use of students and teachers.

The centre provides guidance for various competitive examinations like Indian Civil Services and HCS (Preliminary Examination), NET/JRF (UGC), Bank Probationary Officer's, HTET (PGT), CDS and others from time to time. Besides above, special lectures are organized by experts in the relevant field.

UNIVERSITY CAREER COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL

The Career Counseling and Placement Cell have been established in MDU under the UGC plan. It provides good platform for students to represent their career developmental needs in their respective departments and fields. It facilitates the process of planing and executing appropriate interventions that addresses those needs. The cell also serves the purpose of bringing a better or more direct connection between the different stakeholders. The main endeavour of CCPC pf is to get students placed in reputed multinationals, government organizations, NGO's and private sector. All students of the University Teaching Departments are provided placement assistance, counselling for employment and self/social entrepreneurship. The CCPC assure logistic support to the visiting companies at every stage of the placement process by making university infrastructure available to them. The CCPC acts as an interface between the industry and the students, and enable the students to select from their career options. The CCPC facilitates the selection process of all the companies as per their requirement. The CCPC also conducts seminars and workshops to enable the students of the University to become successful professionals.



CENTRE FOR INTERNATIONAL ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

The University has a full-fledged Centre for International Academic Affairs that provides necessary guidance to foreign nationals in getting admission to various programmes offered by the University. Dean, Academic Affairs is Ex-officio Dean, to the Centre for International Academic Affairs, who is assisted by Advisor.

Centre for International Academic Affairs performs as a single window to address various queries of foreign nationals related to academics, admissions, examinations, hostels etc. To make the admission process simple, a dedicated portal is already in place for admission seekers from other countries. There are 15 per cent supernumerary seats for foreign candidates in each University Teaching Department (Except the programme run under the norms of AICTE/PCI). International students can take admission into undergraduate, postgraduate, research and professional courses in the university campus and its affiliated colleges. Foreign nationals from Uganda, Kenya, Rwanda, Zimbabwe, Nigeria, Congo, South Korea, Bhutan, Iraq, Afghanistan and many other countries have already shaped their academic future from this University. During academic session 2018-19, 40 foreign nationals took admission in various courses (List Attached). Out of these 40 students, 37 students are from Iraq, two from Afghanistan and remaining one is from Kenya. 14 foreign nationals are continuing their study during the session 2018-19.

Major functions of the Cell are:

- To coordinate the exchange programmes of the university with various foreign universities.
- To explore the possibility of offering joint academic programmes with foreign universities.
- To attract eminent scholars from foreign universities to teach courses at MDU Campus.
- To coordinate the admission process of International students.
- To perform as a single window to address various queries of foreign nationals.
- To deal with all activities pertaining to the admission of International students.
- To undertake joint research projects with the scholars of foreign universities.
- To help students in Monitoring and Mentoring in their academic requirements and their academic progression.
- To organize various extra-curricular activities i.e. sports and cultural activities for these students.
- To organize sensitization and orientation (induction) Programme for these students so as to make them aware about the departments and other facilities available at University level.
- It addresses any other academic or administrative problems faced by foreign students.

The Foreign Students' Cell is constantly striving and committed to provide hassle free and conducive environment wherein the foreign students can actualize their potentialities and refine their skills to become expert in their respective fields.

SCHEDULED CASTE/ SCHEDULED TRIBE CELL

The S.C/S.T cell, established by the University under sub-clause (1) of paragraph 6 of UGC guidelines has been functioning since June 1984, to process the grievances of the members of Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe communities. It functions under the overall supervision of the Liaison Officer and works for the welfare of SC/ST candidates. It monitors the implementation of policies and programmes related to admissions, appointments and promotions of SC/ST candidates. The cell endeavours to ensure the benefits of Central Government/State Government policies related to the welfare of SC/ST students and employees. This SC/ST cell collects information/data and send the information's to the quarter concerned from time to time.

This special cell circulates/displays notice/announcements/directives received from time to time from various quarters at prominent places with regard to admissions, special financial assistance etc. for drawing the attention of the Reserved Category Candidates.

The Cell also maintains the Complaint Register as per guidelines of UGC to resolve the complaints/grievances of SC/ST students and employees.

The Public Relations Office works towards projecting and promoting University's image. The office functions effectively to highlight the achievements of the University and its developmental strides in various spheres viz. academics & research, social outreach, literary & cultural activities, games & sports, etc.

The office compiles and collates newspaper clippings related to the university as well as academic/educational matters on daily basis. The newspaper clippings are put up daily for the perusal of Vice-Chancellor, Dean Academic Affairs and the Registrar. Public Relations Office prepares and issues press-releases about the university developments and activities to the Print and Electronic Media on day to day basis. The office also organises press briefing(s) / press conference(s). The advertisement work of the University is also dealt with by the P.R. office.

The Annual Report of the University is prepared by the Public Relations Office as per the information supplied by various teaching departments/branches/offices of the University. The Public Relations Office provides Social Media P. R. updates on Facebook and Twitter highlighting the University activities and events as well as disseminating information related to the university. The P.R. office published a brochure about University's progress journey titled "PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE: THE PROGRESS JOURNEY". The Public Relations Office worked steadfastly for positive image projection of Maharshi Dayanand University.

UNIVERSITY EMPLOYMENT INFORMATION AND GUIDANCE BUREAU

This Bureau undertakes registration work in respect of post graduates, professional graduates and specialized categories of candidates of Rohtak sub division and gives information and guidance to the University alumni.

This Bureau maintains a Career Information Room and provides guidance on Employment opportunities training facilities, competitive examinations and scholarships/fellowships facilities. This Bureau provides information about higher education in India and abroad. Individual information was given to the 1286 applicants.

48 group discussions were arranged which were attended by 444 students, 24 applicants were given individual guidance.

144 applicants were advised for jobs against vacancies advertised in the daily newspapers and Employment News. 1205 applicants and students visited the Career Information Room of this office during the period under report. This Bureau publishes a monthly Bulletin of Information tiled "Career Digest", and Career publication of different topics under report from time to time.

Efforts were made by this Bureau to get 30 prospectuses from the Universities of India and abroad. 5 Jagrati camps were organized by this office period under this report in these camps information regarding jobs, admissions, training, self employment schemes, and employment opportunities in private sectors, employment at abroad and self employment schemes.
