Questions for Assignments of M.A. 1st Sem. (DDE) Literature in English (1550-1660) – I Paper Code-EN1001-1

• Total Marks: 20

• Each question carries 5 Marks

Unit I –

It is said that King Lear is "more sinned against than sinning". How far do you agree to the statement? Elaborate.

Or

Write a detailed essay on the plot-construction and structure of *King Lear*.

Unit II –

How might *The Alchemist* be considered a comedy of humours? Comment.

Or

Write a detailed note on Ben Jonson's art of characterization in the play *The Alchemist*.

Unit III -

Discuss John Dryden as a 'metaphysical poet' in the light of the poems prescribed in your syllabus.

Or

Write down a critical analysis of the two poems of Andrew Marvel prescribed in your syllabus – "To His Coy Mistress" and "The Garden".

Unit IV –

Comment on the presence of social and religious conflict in Thomas More's *Utopia*.

Or

What are the major thematic concerns of Thomas More in the writing of *Utopia*?

Unit I -

Discuss Dryden's Absalom and Achitophel as a biblical allegory.

Or

Do you agree that *Absalom and Achitophel* is a satiric masterpiece? Justify your answer.

Unit II –

Do you think that Congreve's *The Way of the World* is an epitome of comedy of manners? Elaborate your response.

Or

How far does the play *The Way of the World* succeed in painting a true picture of the eighteenth century social life and manners? Comment.

Unit III -

Do you consider Moll Flanders' journey to be one from sin to repentance? Discuss in detail.

Or

Discuss *Moll Flanders* as a picaresque novel.

Unit IV -

Make a critical analysis of the two essays by Addison – "Aim of the Spectator" and "The Scope of Satire".

Or

Write a detailed note on the use of irony in Addison's essays.

Unit I -

Critically analyze the poem "Intimations of Immortality" by Wordsworth.

Or

Comment on John Keats as a writer of odes.

Unit II -

What are the major thematic concerns of Emily Bronte in *Wuthering Heights*? Discuss in detail.

Or

Attempt a critical study of the relationship of Catherine Earnshaw and Heathcliff.

Unit III –

Write a detailed note on the various themes and symbols referred to in Whitman's *Songs of Myself* with special reference to the poems prescribed in your syllabus.

Or

Comment on the symbols of 'birth' and 'death' in the poem "Out of the Craddle Endlessly Rocking".

Unit IV -

Discuss Flaubert's Madame Bovary as a realistic novel.

Or

Draw a character sketch of Emma Bovary and illustrate how she is responsible for her own downfall.

Literature in English (1914 to present) – I Paper Code-EN1004-1

Unit I -

Comment on Lawrence's Sons and Lovers as novel about human relationships.

Or

Attempt a symbolical study of D.H. Lawrence's Sons and Lovers.

Unit II -

Discuss T.S. Eliot as a modern poet in the light of the poem *The Wasteland*.

Or

Do you really think that the poem "The Love Song of J. Alfred Prufrock" is a 'love song'? Justify your answer.

Unit III -

What kind of relationship do the two brothers – Victor and Walter – share in the play *Price*? Also point out the reasons.

Or

Write a detailed note on the major thematic concerns of Arthur Miller in the play *Price*.

Unit IV -

Write an essay on the significance of the title of the play *Look Back in Anger* by John Osborne.

Or

Examine the character of Jimmy Porter in Look Back in Anger by Osborne.

Poetry – I Paper Code-EN1005-1

• Each question carries 5 Marks

Unit I –

What was Spenser's primary purpose in writing *The Faerie Queene*? Discuss in detail.

Or

Identify what quality each character stands for in Spenser's *The Faerie Queene*.

Unit II –

Attempt a thematic study of Coleridge's *The Rime of the Ancient Mariner*.

Or

Critically analyze the poem *Kubla Khan* by Coleridge.

Unit III -

Write a detailed essay on the theme and imagery in the poems of W. B. Yeats prescribed in your syllabus.

Or

Based on a reading of the poems of Yeats, do you consider Yeats as an escapist? Justify your answer.

Unit IV –

What, according to you, are the major thematic concerns of A.K. Ramanujan in the poems prescribed in your syllabus?

Or

Attempt a critical study of any three poems of Ramanujan that are part of your syllabus.
