ANNUAL REPORT OF YOUTH RED CROSS ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR 2023-2024

1. First Aid Post in Induction Program at Tagore Auditorium from 09.08.2023 to 12.08.2023

Integrating first aid training into a student induction program equips students with essential life-saving skills and fosters a culture of safety and responsibility. The four-day Induction Program was organized by the Dean of Students Welfare of Maharshi Dayanand University from 09.08.2023 to 12.08.2023. In this Program, the YRC volunteers provided services through the First Aid. Five First Aid posts were set up during this event for emergency help. Student Coordinators Mr. Pratik Malik and Ms. Devanshi and the volunteer team have actively participated in this event. This event empowers them to respond effectively during emergencies such as injuries, choking, or cardiac arrests, potentially saving lives. Beyond immediate medical aid, the training boosts students' confidence, encourages preventive safety measures, and enhances their mental preparedness for crises. It also promotes teamwork, community awareness, and a health-conscious mindset, making them proactive contributors to a safer environment. Furthermore, first aid certification adds value to their resumes, reflecting leadership and a sense of responsibility. By including first aid in induction programs, institutions prepare students to care for themselves and others, instilling vital skills that benefit both campus life and society.





2. Participation in CPR Documentary organized by IRCS at M.D. University on 01.09.2023 to 02.09.2023

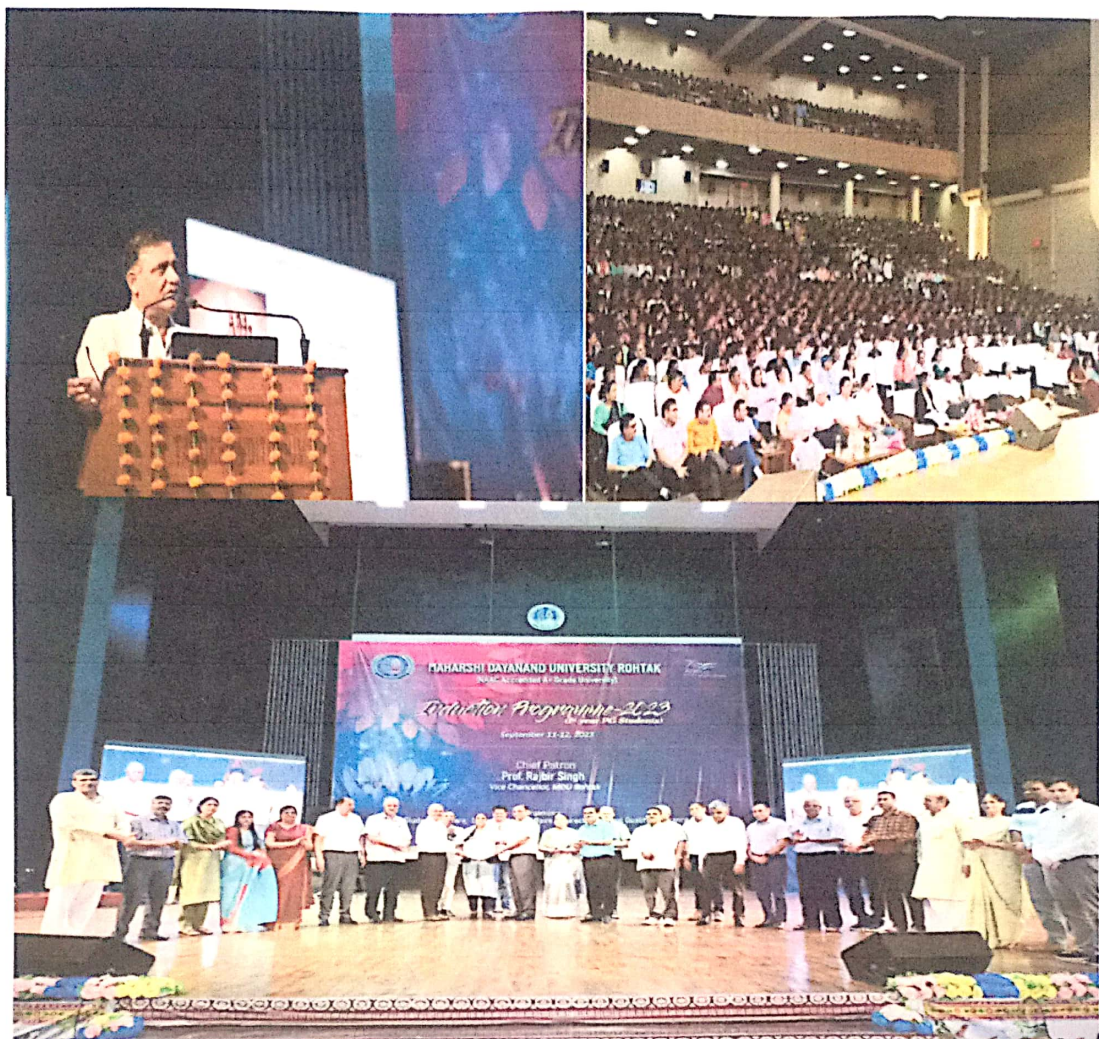
As per the desire of His Excellency, the Governor cum President, St. John Ambulance (India) Haryana State, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) training through documentary and live demonstration by St. John Ambulance (India), District Centre, Rohtak is being given at different districts of Haryana State from 25th Aug 2023 to 9th Sep 2023. In Rohtak District, socially active institutes were selected to impart this training for two days (1st & 2nd Sep 2023). For the said training, a mobile van from St. John Ambulance India, Haryana State Branch Chandigarh, reached outside the Mechanical Engineering block, YRC office on 01.09.2023 at 2 pm to train YRC, NSS, and NCC volunteers. A live demonstration was seen by the participants, and then the volunteers were given CPR training at the YRC office by Sh. Ravi Dutt, District Training Officer, St. John Ambulance (India) District Centre Rohtak. This training program is important to make people aware and save human lives from heart attack, cardiac arrest, and other diseases when the breathing of the victim is not present.

Approximately 150 YRC, NSS, and NCC volunteers participated in this program. Prof. Anju Dhiman (Program Coordinator YRC) & Prof. Tilak Raj (Program Coordinator NSS) coordinated the event. Dr. Dhiraj Khurana, Dr. Asha Sharma, Mr. M.C. Dhiman, Mr. Sandeep, and Mr. Jitender were present.



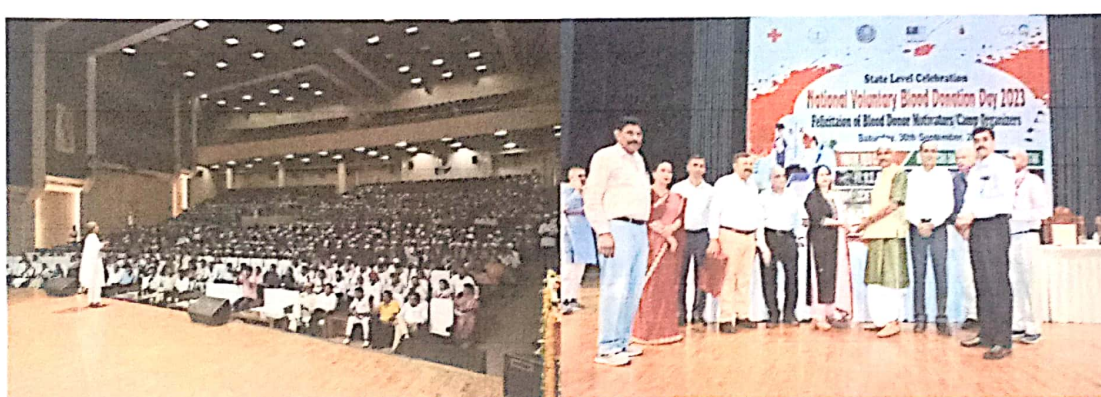
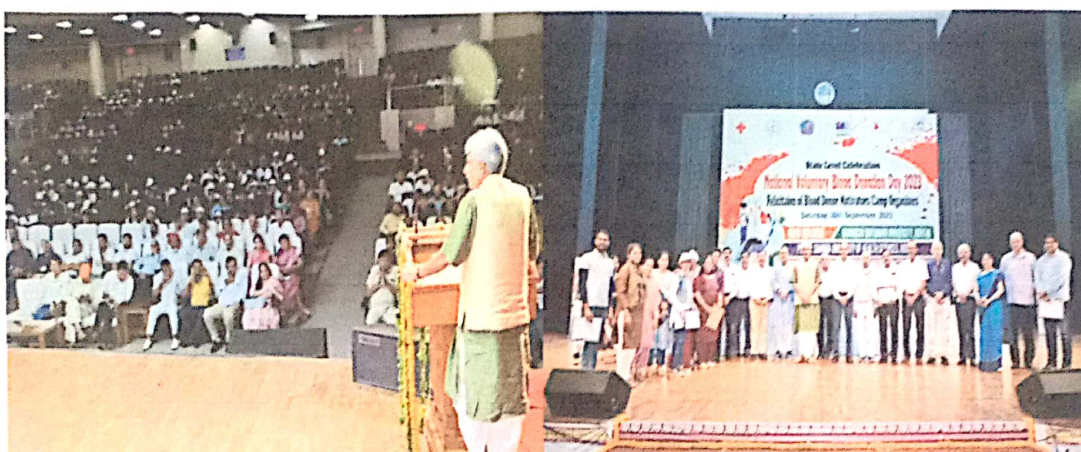
3. First Aid Post in Induction Program at Tagore Auditorium

5. Celebration of Gandhi Jayanti at Tagore Auditorium on 02.10.2023

The change you want to see in the world, bring it in yourself - the call to imbibe this statement of Mahatma Gandhi in life was expressed by the Vice Chancellor of Maharishi Dayanand University, Prof. Rajbir Singh, in the Gandhi Jayanti celebrations held in the Tagore Auditorium of the University. This program was organized under the guidance of the Student Welfare Office of the University.

10. Seven day program on World HIV/AIDS from 24.11.2023 to 30.11.2023

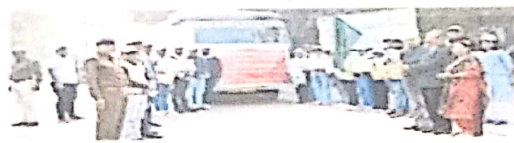

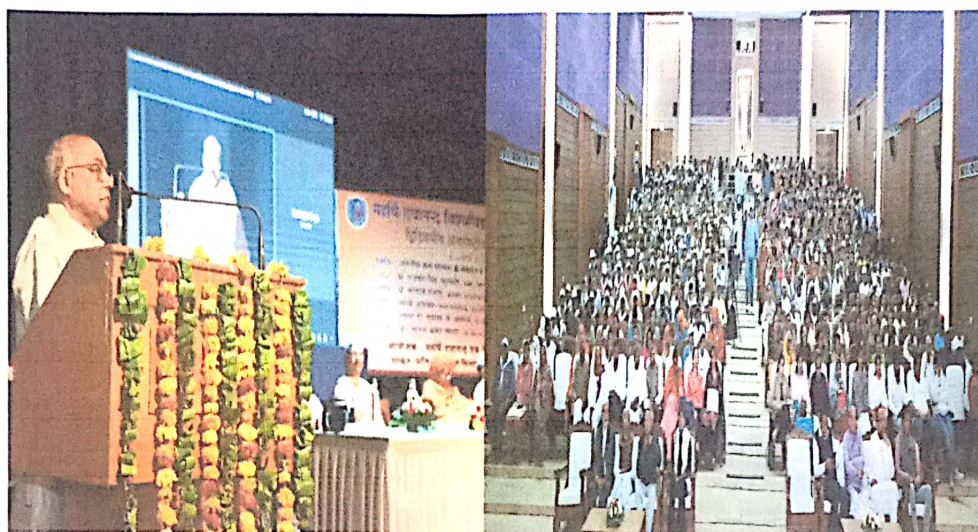
18. Celebration of Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati Jayanti at R.K. Auditorium on 05.03.2024

They contributed their services across several committees, including discipline, traffic management, and the establishment of first aid posts, among others. Some of the key events where YRC volunteers provided valuable community service include the **Drug-Free Campaign** and **Declamation Contest** on January 11, 2024, the **Republic Day Celebration**, and the **49th Foundation Day** of Maharshi Dayanand University on April 19, 2024.



23. Seven days Health Awareness camp from 23.04.2024 to 29.04.2024 at C.D.O.E. Conference Hall

The University Youth Red Cross (YRC), MDU, organized a 7-day Health Awareness and Training Camp from April 23 to April 29, 2024, designed to empower youth with essential health knowledge and practical skills. This initiative aimed to raise health awareness and promote community welfare among young individuals. The camp featured a series of expert-led sessions, healthcare professionals, and experienced volunteers who shared valuable insights and experiences with the participants. In addition, hands-on training was provided, allowing participants to apply their learning to real-life situations, thereby enhancing their confidence and preparedness to address health-related challenges.

Key highlights of the camp were:

1. Workshops on First Aid Techniques and Emergency Response
2. Health Awareness Sessions on Hygiene, Nutrition, and Disease Prevention
3. Interactive Discussions on Mental Health and Stress Management
4. Practical Demonstrations on Basic Medical Procedures and Wound Care

The inaugural session was honoured by the presence of Dr. Sharanjeet Kaur, Chief Guest from the Rehabilitation Council of India. Dr. Kaur commended the efforts of the University Youth Red Cross and emphasized the importance of inclusivity for disabled children in society. She urged the volunteers to organize campaigns that would benefit disabled children, promoting their education and making them feel an integral part of the community.

The Guests of Honour included Sh. Sunil Jaglan, Professor of Practice and Former Sarpanch of Bibipur, Jind, and Professor Arun Nanda, Dean of Research and Development, MDU. Sh. Jaglan shared their experiences campaigning for the "Beti Bachao Beti Padhao" initiative during his tenure as the Sarpanch of Bibipur. He also spoke about his efforts to improve health and hygiene for women in his village and neighbouring areas. Professor Nanda highlighted the importance of knowledge about homemade remedies for common diseases and emphasized the need to reduce reliance on expensive medications.

An expert talk was delivered by Shri Ravi Dutt, District Training Officer, Red Cross Society Rohtak. His session focused on simple yet effective methods to treat routine health issues such as fever, malaria, anaemia, and dengue. Participants engaged actively with Shri Dutt, asking questions and seeking advice on practical solutions for these common health concerns. The camp concluded with a vote of thanks by Sh. M.C. Dhiman, Field Coordinator, YRC, MDU. Approximately 100 YRC volunteers from various affiliated colleges and UTDs registered for the camp. The event was successfully coordinated by Dr. Asha Sharma, YRC Counsellor, with Dr. Dhiraj Khurana and Dr. Kavita ensuring the smooth running of the program.





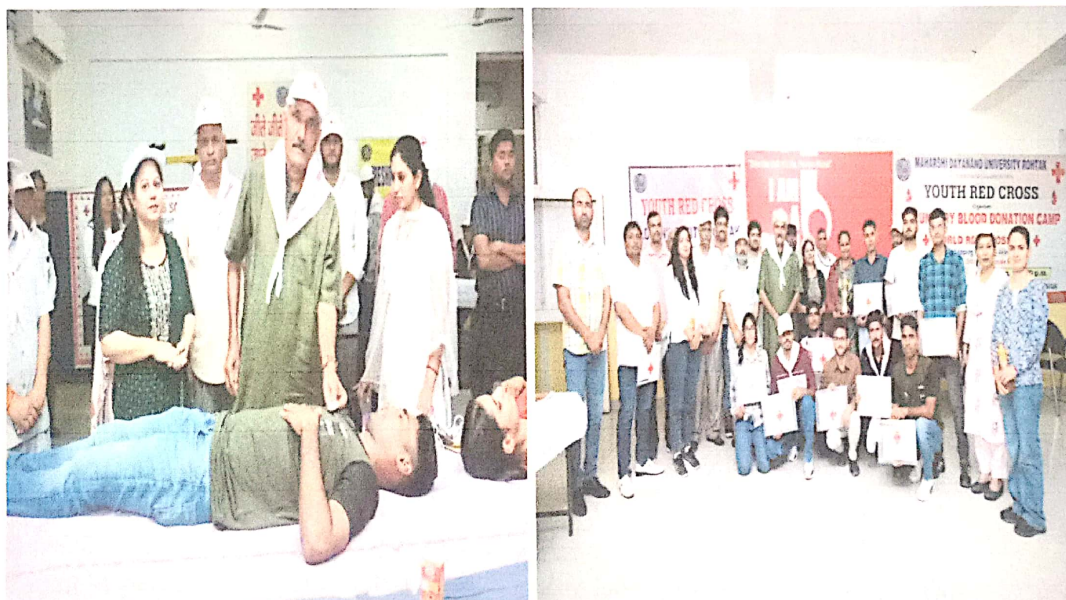
24. Rally on Road Safety in MDU Campus on 27.04.2024

A 'Rally on Road Safety' was organized at the MDU Campus on April 27, 2024, in collaboration with the Outreach Programme, NCC, NSS, and Civil Engineering UIET at the DDE Conference Hall, MDU Rohtak. Dr. Anju Dhiman, Programme Coordinator of the Youth Red Cross at MDU, provided an overview of the key highlights of the rally, emphasizing the importance of raising awareness about road safety to prevent accidents and save lives. The event was officially flagged off by the Registrar, Prof. Gulshan Lal Taneja. A total of 445 volunteers, along with their teacher in-charges from UTD, YRC, NCC, NSS, and the Outreach Programme, participated in the rally, reinforcing the collective commitment to promoting safe road practices across the community.



25. Organization of a Blood Donation camp on the occasion of World Red Cross Day on 08.05.2024

A Blood Donation Camp was organized on the occasion of World Red Cross Day on May 8, 2024. Prof. Rajbir Singh, Vice-Chancellor of MDU Rohtak, was invited as the Chief Guest. He honored the blood donors with badges and certificates in recognition of their selfless contribution. During the event, Prof. Rajbir Singh highlighted the critical importance of blood donation in saving lives, stating that “blood donation is life donation.” He encouraged volunteers to donate blood at least twice a year and to inspire others in society to participate in this noble cause. A total of 47 units of blood were collected during the camp, contributing significantly to the community's healthcare needs





26. One Day Basic First Aid and Disaster Management Training for YRC Volunteers at Swaraj Sadan on 15.06.2024

The Youth Red Cross organized a 'One Day Basic First Aid and Disaster Management Training' session for YRC Volunteers on June 15, 2024, at Swaraj Sadan. Prof. Rajbir Singh, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of MDU, Rohtak, graced the event as the Chief Guest. Prof. Harish Dureja, HOD of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Dean of the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at MDU joined the event as the Guest of Honour. Mr. Rajbir Dalal, Fire Officer from Rohtak, and Mr. Vishnu Mittar, Lecturer in First Aid and Home Nursing, were invited as resource persons.

Dr. Anju Dhiman, Program Coordinator of YRC, delivered the welcome address and provided an overview of the program. Mr. Rajbir Dalal emphasized the importance of fire safety awareness in maintaining safe environments at homes, workplaces, and public spaces. He stressed that understanding fire hazards and knowing how to respond in emergencies can save lives and prevent significant property damage. Mr. Vishnu Mittar highlighted the importance of learning first aid, illustrating his point with a poem. He explained that the techniques employed by a first-aider help preserve life, prevent further injury, and promote recovery. He noted that immediate care can prevent complications, reduce infection risks, and begin the healing process right after an injury.

Prof. Harish Dureja elaborated on the concept of First Aid, defining it as 'First Investigation Relief Symptom Treatment Arrangement Immediately Disposal.' He encouraged the volunteers to work with passion to acquire any skill and motivated them to engage with complete dedication in both academic and social welfare activities. Prof. Rajbir Singh, Vice Chancellor of MDU, spoke about the value of prevention, quoting 'Prevention is better than cure.' He highlighted the moral, ethical, and humanitarian aspects of helping others, noting that such actions improve social interactions and community understanding. He also stressed the importance of both physical and mental well-being, explaining that an active person is less likely to experience depression.

Prof. Rajbir Singh encouraged students to focus on personality development, soft skills, and life skills, stating that 'Passion' and 'Compassion' are essential for success in life. Following the inaugural session, Mr. Vishnu Mittar provided a detailed talk on Basic First Aid and Disaster Risk Management. He discussed common injuries from road accidents, the types of treatment required, and explained the human bone structure and different types of fractures. He also covered the significance of CPR and the necessary precautions to take during its administration. Furthermore, he discussed various types of wounds and the proper techniques for applying a slab to an injured part. Mr. Mittar concluded with a discussion on shock, its signs, symptoms, and management.

In the afternoon session, Mr. Rajbir Dalal gave an informative talk on fire safety and its first aid. He introduced the golden rule of ABC (Airway, Breathing, Circulation) and discussed the different types and levels of fire. Mr. Dalal also addressed the common causes of domestic fires and strategies for their prevention. The session included a live demonstration on how to control fire from gas cylinders commonly used in households. To make the session interactive, he also demonstrated the functioning of the fire brigade and its approach to controlling various types of fires.



27. Celebration of International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking on 26.06.2024

The International Day against Drug Abuse and Illicit Trafficking was held on June 26, 2024, at the IHTM Conference Hall, MDU, Rohtak. The theme of the event was *"The Evidence is Clear: Invest in Prevention."* The program was organized by the University Youth Red Cross (YRC) in collaboration with the University Outreach Program, National Service Scheme (NSS), and National Cadet Corps (NCC). The event began with the floral welcome of the Chief Guest and Guests of Honour, followed by the lighting of the lamp and the university's Kulgeet. Dr. Anju Dhiman, Coordinator of YRC, commenced the program with a welcome address. Dr. S.S. Lohchab, Director of P.G.I.M.S and the Chief Guest of the program, emphasized the severity of the drug abuse problem and its rapid spread across countries. Prof. Raj Kumar, Chief Consultant of the University Outreach Program, further enlightened the audience on the program's objectives. Prof. Pardeep Kumar, Consultant at PSW, SIMH, PGIMS Rohtak, delivered the keynote address. He discussed the abuse of various substances and highlighted how individuals with alcohol addiction are more likely to develop drug addiction. Brigadier Harbir Singh, Commander of the NCC and Guest of Honour, raised awareness about the increasing drug trade in Punjab and Haryana.

Mr. Manmeet Kohli, Managing Director of Masu Breaks Private Ltd., Rohtak, stressed the need for collective efforts to combat drug abuse in order to ensure a healthier future. Prof. Randeep Rana, Dean of Students Welfare at M.D.U., shared his message with the quote, "The health and wealth of a nation are measured by its youth," and discussed the importance of saying "No" to drugs and utilizing social media positively to raise awareness among young people.

A competition was held on creating a storyboard with the theme *"The Evidence is clear: Invest in Prevention against Drug Abuse."* The winner of the competition was Vinita Balhara, a BCA student from UIET. Vishwajeet Singh from LN Hindu College secured second place, while Himani, a student from the Centre for Disability Studies, and Rekha, a BA Hindi student from Pt. NRS College, received third and consolation prizes, respectively. The program concluded with everyone taking a pledge against drug abuse.

The vote of thanks was delivered by Dr. Savita Rathee, Program Coordinator of NSS. The event was coordinated by Dr. Asha Sharma, YRC Counselor, and Dr. Ekta Narwal, Deputy Director of the Outreach Program. Prof. Vinita Shukla, Director of the University Campus School, Dr. Karamvir Shoekand, Deputy Director of the University Outreach Program, Dr. Anju Panwar, NSS Program Officer, NCC officers Dr. Vikas Sindhu and Dr. Aarti, YRC Counselor Dr. Dheeraj Khurana, Dr. Jasmer, NSS Program Officer from Jaat College Rohtak, and Dr. Vineet Bala, YRC Counselor from Vaish College, were also present. The event was attended by approximately 150 participants.


