MDU makes history again: 22 researchers included in Stanford's list of top 2% scientists

Maharshi Dayanand University has once again made a mark globally. In its prestigious list released by Stanford University, USA, and published in Elsevier BV, 15 faculty members and seven students from MDU have been recognized among the world's top 2% scientists. This list was released on September 19, 2025.

This achievement is a testament to MDU's growing reputation in research and innovation. Vice-Chancellor Prof. Rajbir Singh while congratulating the university family on this success, stated that MDU's research ecosystem is continuously strengthening and gaining international recognition. He emphasized the university's focus on quality research, interdisciplinary collaboration, and global standards.

The Registrar, Dr. K.K. Gupta, and Dean of Academic Affairs, Prof. S.C. Malik, also extended their congratulations to the faculty members and students on this glorious moment.

This year, four faculty members have been recognized both for their career long research contributions and their exceptional output in 2024 - Prof. C.S. Pundir (Biochemistry, retired), Prof. Narasimhan B. (Pharmaceutical Sciences), Dr. Sarvjeet Singh Gill (Biotechnology), and Dr. Bijender Singh (Microbiology), and 7 students have been included for their notable research work in 2024.

The recognized faculty members include Prof. Jaya Prakash Yadav (Genetics), Prof. Naveen Kumar(Chemistry), Dr. Vineet Kumar Singla (UIET), Prof. Krishna Kant Sharma (Microbiology), Prof. Devender Singh (Chemistry), Prof. Harish Dureja (Pharmaceutical Science), Prof. Ramphul Ohlan (IMSAR), Prof. Rajesh Punia (Physics), Dr. Deepak Chhabra (UIET), Dr. Anil Ohlan (Physics), Prof. Nar Singh Chauhan(Biochemistry). The students who received this honor include Priyanka, Anju Hooda, Kapisha Nehra, Anuj Dalal, Isha Gupta, Vikas Kumar and Mukesh Suresh Yogendra Kumar.

Stanford's database evaluates the world's top 100,000 scientists or top 2% category researchers based on citation index, H-index, co-authorship indicators, and composite score (C-score). MDU's research achievements have also been appreciated in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF). Despite the fact that about 90 faculty members retired in the last six years, MDU has shown significant growth in both quantitative and qualitative research standards.

The university leadership believes that timely faculty appointments will enable MDU to become a pride not only for Haryana but for the country as well. MDU's continuous progress is evident, with the number of researchers increasing from 14 in 2023 to 19 in 2024 and 22 in 2025, further strengthening its position on the global research map.





(CDOE) has implemented provisions of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 in all its programmes offered through Open and Distance Learning (ODL) as well as through Online Learning (OL) modes.

The scheme and syllabi of the programmes offered by CDOE are aligned with those of conventional, on-campus programmes. Currently, the Centre offers:

- ▶11 postgraduate programmes through the ODL mode 7 postgraduate programmes through the OL mode For undergraduate learners, CDOE provides the flexibility to choose from eight subjects available in both ODL and OL modes. Skill Enhancement courses have been introduced for both PG & UG programmes. Additionally, from the current academic session, CDOF has introduced:
- ▶ A Certificate Course in Food Truck Operation, offered through both ODL and OI modes
- ▶ A Certificate Course in Professional Skills, offered through the Online Learning mode All programmes offered by the Centre are duly approved by the Distance Education Bureau (DEB) of the University Grants Commission (UGC), Government of India.


