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ROHTAK: THE HOST CITY

Rohtak, pulsating with people and vitality, is a city with historical past, a vibrant present and a promising future. The city is about 50 miles from National Capital Delhi on Delhi-Hisar National Highway (NH-09), about 240 Kms from the state capital Chandigarh and 150 Kms from Kurukshetra (a famous ancient place in Haryana). Rohtak is well connected both by rail and road. The nearest Airport (80 Kms) is Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi. Rohtak city is famous as an educational hub in the north-western part of India. The weather of Rohtak is continental type recording high temperatures in May and June whereas December and January months are coldest. Weather during February, March, September, October and November is pleasant.

MAHARSHI DAYANAND UNIVERSITY, ROHTAK

Established in 1976, Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak (Haryana) is named after Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati, a prominent 19th century social reformer and founder of Arya Samaj movement. DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY

The Department of Geography came into existence in 1983. It envisions a leading centre of teaching, learning and research on interface between physical and human domains with emphasis on field methods, quantitative and qualitative analyses and geospatial technologies. A distinct identity of the department is its interdisciplinary nature capitalizing on the emerging physical and socio-economic issues confronting the society at large. The department embrace a 'student centred' approach, teaching a well rounded curriculum that allows the department to better respond to students' need and incorporate more disciplinary advances into curriculum. BACKGROUND OF THE CONFERENCE
