New Delhi: The Delhi High Court on Tuesday asked the members of a restaurant body to use the term "staff contribution" for the amount they were claiming from their customers as a "service charge". Justice Prathiba M Singh, who was hearing the petitions against guidelines for automatically levying service charge on food bills directed by the Federation of Hotels and Restaurant Associations of India (FHRAI) and

Kerala man hacks woman, ends own life

Kochi: A 25-year-old college student hacked his female friend in Ernakulam district on Tuesday and then allegedly died by suicide, police said.

The incident was reported from Kurumampady village near Perumbavoor this morning.

Basil attacked Alka (20), a nursing student, at her house using a sharp-edged weapon.

Soon after the incident, he was found hanging inside his house. A senior police official from the district said the woman suffered a deep injury to her skull and is undergoing treatment. She is known to Basil from school days, he said.

"shooting the messenger", they said the action against the guild ill behoves the largest democracy in the world and the FIR should be withdrawn immediately.

Pertinent National Restaurant Association of India, which has around 1,100 members, however, said service charge was the accepted terminology that cannot

be replaced and there was no confusion with respect to its use. "The member would require a hearing. In the meantime, it is difficult to use the term 'staff contribution' for the amount of service charge that they are charging," the court said. The same shall not be more than 10 per cent excluding GST. The senior counsel for FHRAI said so.

Living together in marriage not irreversible, says court

New Delhi: Living together in marriage is not an irreversible act, and when the court registered the FIR in voting several sections of the Indian Penal Code (IPC) in the situation, the Delhi High Court Thursday said while upholding an order granting divorce to an estranged couple which was living separately for 15 years.

A bench headed by Justice Suresh Kumar Kait dealing with the wife's appeal against a family court order grant-

ing divorce, observed there was no

change of circumstance between the parties and the long separation "pegs" with false allegations, police re-

ports and criminal trial by the appeal court was a source of mental cruelty.

Any insistence either on continuing

Illegal to force under-3 to attend school, says HC

Ahmedabad: Parents who force children below the age of three years to attend preschool are liable to a punishment of "illegal act," the Gujarat High Court said while dismissing a batch of pleas challenging the state government's decision to set six years as the minimum age limit for admission in the academic Class I admission in the academic year 2023-24.

A group of parents of children who did not complete six years as on June 1, 2023 sought to challenge the date January 31, 2020 prescribing the age limit for admission to Class I in the academic year 2023-24. "Forcing

children to go to a preschool below the age of 3 years is an illegal action of the part of the parents who are penitent before us," the division

bench of Chief Justice Sunita Agar-

wal and Justice N. Anjaria observed

February 18, 2012, it said. The petitioners sought to challenge fixing June as a cut-off date of the current academic year 2023-24 only because this will deprive around nine lakh children in the state of their right to education.
