Rules

Poster Making Competition

- All participants for Poster making competition are supposed to make poster on the spot.
- The poster must be made on the A2 size (16-1/2 x 23-3/8 inches) sheet
- Poster can be made using pencil, crayon, watercolour, oil paint, etc. Photographs, wires, other 3D objects, print-outs won't be acceptable. It should be hand made only.
- The essential material required for poster making shall be carried by participants by themselves except the sheet.
- Poster should not contain any personal details like Name, Class, Centre etc. of the participants. Participant will be provided a code and same should be mentioned only at the back of the sheet.
- The participants may be required to explain their poster to the judges.
- All participants must make poster relevant to the theme of the competition only
- Poster shall not contain any message on it.
- Creativity, design, colours and explanation of poster shall be the merit criteria.
- The decision of the judges shall be final and no sort of disputes shall be entertained.

Rules

Slogan Writing Competition

- All participants for Slogan writing competition are supposed to write slogan on the spot.
- The slogan must be written on the A3 size (11.7 x 16.5 inches) sheet.
- Slogan can be written by using pencil, crayon, watercolour, oil paint, etc. Photographs, wires, other 3D objects, print-outs won't be acceptable. It should be hand made only.
- The essential material required for slogan writing shall be carried by participants by themselves except the sheet
- Slogan should not contain any personal details like Name, Class, Centre etc. of the participants. Participant will be provided a code and same should be mentioned only at the back of the sheet.
- The participants may be required to explain their slogan to the judges.
- All participants must provide a slogan relevant to the theme of the competition in no more than 20 words
- Slogan must be written in English or Hindi only
- Message of slogan, design, content and explanation of slogan shall be the merit criteria.
- The decision of the judges shall be final and no sort of disputes shall be entertained.
