ANNUAL REPORT OF YOUTH RED CROSS ACTIVITIES FOR THE YEAR 2023-2024

1. First Aid Post in Induction Program at Tagore Auditorium from 09.08.2023 to 12.08.2023

Integrating first aid training into a student induction program equips students with essential life-saving skills and fosters a culture of safety and responsibility. The four-day Induction Program was organized by the Dean of Students Welfare of Maharshi Dayanand University from 09.08.2023 to 12.08.2023. In this Program, the YRC volunteers provided services through the First Aid. Five First Aid posts were set up during this event for emergency help. Student Coordinators Mr. Pratik Malik and Ms. Devanshi and the volunteer team have actively participated in this event. This event empowers them to respond effectively during emergencies such as injuries, choking, or cardiac arrests, potentially saving lives. Beyond immediate medical aid, the training boosts students' confidence, encourages preventive safety measures, and enhances their mental preparedness for crises. It also promotes teamwork, community awareness, and a health-conscious mindset, making them proactive contributors to a safer environment. Furthermore, first aid certification adds value to their resumes, reflecting leadership and a sense of responsibility. By including first aid in induction programs, institutions prepare students to care for themselves and others, instilling vital skills that benefit both campus life and society.







2. Participation in CPR Documentary organized by IRCS at M.D. University on 01.09.2023 to 02.09.2023

As per the desire of His Excellency, the Governor cum President, St. John Ambulance (India) Haryana State, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) training through documentary and live demonstration by St. John Ambulance (India), District Centre, Rohtak is being given at different districts of Haryana State from 25th Aug 2023 to 9th Sep 2023. In Rohtak District, socially active institutes were selected to impart this training for two days (1st & 2nd Sep 2023). For the said training, a mobile van from St. John Ambulance India, Haryana State Branch Chandigarh, reached outside the Mechanical Engineering block, YRC office on 01.09.2023 at 2 pm to train YRC, NSS, and NCC volunteers. A live demonstration was seen by the participants, and then the volunteers were given CPR training at the YRC office by Sh. Ravi Dutt, District Training Officer, St. John Ambulance (India) District Centre Rohtak. This training program is important tomake people aware and save human lives from heart attack, cardiac arrest, and other diseases when the breathing of the victim is not present.

Approximately 150 YRC, NSS, and NCC volunteers participated in this program. Prof. Anju Dhiman (Program Coordinator YRC) & Prof. Tilak Raj (Program Coordinator NSS) coordinated the event. Dr. Dhiraj Khurana, Dr. Asha Sharma, Mr. M.C. Dhiman, Mr. Sandeep, and Mr. Jitender were present.

16. One day health-check up camp on 16.02.2024 at MDU adopted village (Bhali Anandpur)

A One-day health checkup camp was organized by Youth Red Cross in collaboration with National Service Scheme and Outreach Cell of Maharshi Dayanand University in village Bhali Anandpur. In this health check-up camp, general check-up of villagers including BP, sugar check-

up, gynecology check-up, teeth and eyes check-up was done free of cost. General check-up includes testing of sugar, BP, HB etc. was done by Dr. Pahal Yadav and his team from Kainos Hospital. Free eye check-up was done by Dr. Manoj and his team from IQ Hospital: Free dental check-up was arranged by PGIDS in which Dr. Ritu Phogat took a lead role. Gynecological examination was done by Dr. Swati and her team from M.D. University Health Center. Ayurvedic medical consultant Dr. Parveen was invited for one-to-one consultation on Ayurvedic and Panchagavya treatment. In this free camp, 200 villagers were examined. During the examination, cataracts were seen in the eyes and many complaints of pyorrhea were found by team of dentists. During the general examination, complaints of back pain and knee pain were found. Free medicines were also distributed to the villagers in the testing camp. Sarpanch, Shri Jagbir and other members of the village cooperated in the successfully organization of this health check-up camp. 17. Two day "Basic First Aid Training Programme" on 19th -20th February

Two day Basic First Aid Training Program was organized for the teaching staff of UTDs and campus school on 19th to 20th February, 2024. In the technical session, expert talk on "Learn how to perform First Aid" was given by Mr. M.C. Dhiman, Consultant YRC & First Aid Trainer, along with the practical demonstration and scenario of road accident. The training covered both theoretical and practical aspects of CPR, bandaging, choking, unconsciousness, burns, and transportation techniques for injured persons. Sh. Rajbir Dalal from the Fire Office, Rohtak, was invited to provide live training to teacher participants on fire safety, particularly protection from gas cylinder fires. Various types of fire and techniques to extinguish them were discussed, followed by hands-on practical training. Different types and techniques to extinguish fire were discussed and practical training of the same was also given. The program was conducted at Swaraj Sadan in which 90 participants (sixty teachers and thirty YRC volunteers) were present.





18. Celebration of Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati Jayanti at R.K. Auditorium on 05.03.2024

Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati was a prominent advocate of the Indian knowledge tradition. He played a crucial role in establishing human values in society and, through spreading the knowledge of the Vedas, he awakened scientific thinking within Indian philosophy. These ideas were highlighted on the occasion of Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati's 200th birth anniversary during an international seminar titled "Maharshi Dayanand's Contribution to the Promotion of Indian Knowledge Tradition", held at the Radhakrishnan Auditorium, Maharshi Dayanand University (MDU), Rohtak. The two-day seminar, organized jointly by the Maharshi Dayanand

and Vedic Studies Centre, Department of Sanskrit, Pali, and Prakrit, and the Department of Student Welfare at MDU, was inaugurated by Professor Somdev Shatanshu, Vice-Chancellor of Gurukul Kangri University, who attended as the Chief Guest. In his address, Professor Shatanshu referred to Swami Dayanand Saraswati as the flag-bearer of the Indian knowledge tradition, acknowledging his role in awakening Vedic consciousness in both society and the nation. He emphasized that Maharshi Dayanand's contribution to the upliftment of Indian society and the nation would never be forgotten. Dr. Jwalanat Kumar Shastri, former Coordinator of the Sanskrit Department at Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia Avadh University, Ayodhya, delivered the keynote speech. He stated that Swami Dayanand Saraswati significantly strengthened the Indian knowledge tradition through his efforts. Dr. Shastri also discussed how Maharshi Dayanand challenged and opposed the social evils, superstitions, customs, and hypocrisies prevalent in society. He noted that Maharshi Dayanand's work, particularly his book Satyarth Prakash, introduced the society to spirituality and faith. The seminar also saw the presence of Swami Arvavesh, President of the All India Arva Representative Sabha, Delhi, and Padma Shri Dr. Sukama Acharya, who attended as distinguished guests. In their addresses, they highlighted the life philosophy and contributions of Swami Dayanand Saraswati.

Professor Surendra Kumar, Director of the Maharshi Dayanand and Vedic Studies Centre at MDU, delivered the welcome speech and provided insight into the background of the seminar. He elaborated on the profound influence of Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati's ideology and contributions, describing his life philosophy as an inspiration. **Dr. Sunita Saini**, Chairperson of the Department of Sanskrit, Pali, and Prakrit, expressed her gratitude after the session.

The event was attended by MDU faculty members, researchers, students, YRC volunteers, Gurukul students, Arya Samaj members, and several distinguished citizens from the city.

A one-day University-level Youth Red Cross (YRC) Orientation Program for YRC counselors and volunteers from UTD and affiliated colleges was held on March 18, 2024, at Radha Krishnan Sabhagar. the annual reports for the academic years 2021-22 and 2022-23 of MDU, Rohtak. The orientation aimed to raise awareness about Youth Red Cross activities at the university and college levels and to inspire volunteers to engage in voluntary initiatives. Distinguished guests included Prof. Anju Dhiman, YRC Program Coordinator; Prof. A.S. For the session 2021-22, the trophy was awarded to Aggarwal College, Ballabgarh, and A.I.J.H.M. College, Rohtak. The 2022-23 session trophy was awarded to Gaur Brahman Degree College, Rohtak. The event not only aimed to enhance awareness about the pivotal role of YRC activities at the university and college levels but also inspired a renewed commitment among volunteers and counselors to uphold humanitarian values.





20. Tree Plantation Drive on 22.03.2024

A Tree Plantation Drive was successfully organized on 22nd March 2024 by the Youth Red Cross (YRC) of Maharshi Dayanand University in collaboration with the University Outreach Program and the Department of Horticulture and Forestry. The drive marked the celebration of World Water Day, during which 109 saplings of various species—including Trumpet Tree (39), Mexican Silk Cotton (27), Cargestomia Indica (25), and Red Cassia (18)—were planted in key areas across the university campus. Locations such as the administrative block, the UIET-to-sports complex road, and the Gate No. 2 parking area were chosen to highlight the university's commitment to a greener and more sustainable environment.

YRC Program Coordinator Prof. Anju Dhiman highlighted the pivotal role of trees and plants in sustaining life and maintaining ecological balance. She emphasized that medicinal plants are especially significant for communities with limited access to modern healthcare, as they provide essential resources for health and nutrition. Furthermore, trees contribute significantly to water conservation by replenishing water sources and maintaining a healthy water cycle, thereby supporting environmental stability.

Deputy Director of Horticulture, Dr. Surender Kumar Yadav, stressed the importance of plantation activities in maintaining oxygen levels and fostering environmental resilience. **Mr. M.C. 23. Seven days Health Awareness camp from 23.04.2024 to 29.04.2024 at C.D.O.E. Conference Hall

The University Youth Red Cross (YRC), MDU, organized a 7-day Health Awareness and Training Camp from April 23 to April 29, 2024, designed to empower youth with essential health knowledge and practical skills. This initiative aimed to raise health awareness and promote community welfare among young individuals. The camp featured a series of expertled sessions, healthcare professionals, and experienced volunteers who shared valuable insights and experiences with the participants. Key Highlights of the Camp:

- 1. Workshops on First Aid Techniques and Emergency Response

- 3. Interactive Discussions on Mental Health and Stress Management
- 4. Practical Demonstrations on Basic Medical Procedures and Wound Care

The inaugural session was honoured by the presence of Dr. Sharanjeet Kaur, Chief Guest from the Rehabilitation Council of India. Professor Nanda highlighted the importance of knowledge about homemade remedies for common diseases and emphasized the need to reduce reliance on expensive medications.

His session focused on simple yet effective methods to treat routine health issues such as fever, malaria, anaemia, and dengue. Participants engaged actively with Shri Dutt, asking questions and seeking advice on practical solutions for these common health concerns. The camp concluded with a vote of thanks by Sh. M.C. Dhiman, Field Coordinator, YRC, MDU. Approximately 100 YRC volunteers from various affiliated colleges and UTDs registered for the camp. The event was successfully coordinated by Dr. Asha Sharma, YRC Counsellor, with Dr. Dhiraj Khurana and Dr. Kavita ensuring the smooth running of the program.





24. Rally on Road Safety in MDU Campus on 27.04.2024

A 'Rally on Road Safety' was organized at the MDU Campus on April 27, 2024, in collaboration with the Outreach Programme, NCC, NSS, and Civil Engineering UIET at the DDE Conference Hall, MDU Rohtak. Dr. Anju Dhiman, Programme Coordinator of the Youth Red Cross at MDU, provided an overview of the key highlights of the rally, emphasizing the importance of raising awareness about road safety to prevent accidents and save lives. The event was officially flagged off by the Registrar, Prof. Gulshan Lal Taneja. 25. Organization of a Blood Donation camp on the occasion of World Red Cross Day on 08.05.2024

A Blood Donation Camp was organized on the occasion of World Red Cross Day on May 8, 2024. Prof. Rajbir Singh, Vice-Chancellor of MDU Rohtak, was invited as the Chief Guest. He honored the blood donors with badges and certificates in recognition of their selfless contribution. During the event, Prof. Rajbir Singh highlighted the critical importance of blood donation in saving lives, stating that "blood donation is life donation." 26. One Day Basic First Aid and Disaster Management Training for YRC Volunteers at Swaraj Sadan on 15.06.2024

The Youth Red Cross organized a 'One Day Basic First Aid and Disaster Management Training' session for YRC Volunteers on June 15, 2024, at Swaraj Sadan. Prof. Rajbir Singh, the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of MDU, Rohtak, graced the event as the Chief Guest. Prof.

Harish Dureja, HOD of Pharmaceutical Sciences and Dean of the Faculty of Pharmaceutical Sciences at MDU joined the event as the Guest of Honour. Mr. Rajbir Dalal, Fire Officer from Rohtak, and Mr. Vishnu Mittar, Lecturer in First Aid and Home Nursing, were invited as resource persons.

Dr. Anju Dhiman, Program Coordinator of YRC, delivered the welcome address and provided an overview of the program. Mr. Rajbir Dalal emphasized the importance of fire safety awareness in maintaining safe environments at homes, workplaces, and public spaces. He stressed that understanding fire hazards and knowing how to respond in emergencies can save lives and prevent significant property damage. Mr. Vishnu Mittar highlighted the importance of learning first aid, illustrating his point with a poem. He explained that the techniques employed by a first-aider help preserve life, prevent further injury, and promote recovery. He noted that immediate care can prevent complications, reduce infection risks, and begin the healing process right after an injury.

Prof. Harish Dureja elaborated on the concept of First Aid, defining it as 'First Investigation Relief Symptom Treatment Arrangement Immediately Disposal.' He encouraged the volunteers to work with passion to acquire any skill and motivated them to engage with complete dedication in both academic and social welfare activities. Prof. Rajbir Singh, Vice Chancellor of MDU, spoke about the value of prevention, quoting 'Prevention is better than cure.' He highlighted the moral, ethical, and humanitarian aspects of helping others, noting that such actions improve social interactions and community understanding. He also stressed the importance of both physical and mental well-being, explaining that an active person is less likely to experience depression.

Prof. Rajbir Singh encouraged students to focus on personality development, soft skills, and life skills, stating that 'Passion' and 'Compassion' are essential for success in life. Following the inaugural session, Mr. Vishnu Mittar provided a detailed talk on Basic First Aid and Disaster Risk Management. He discussed common injuries from road accidents, the types of treatment required, and explained the human bone structure and different types of fractures. He also covered the significance of CPR and the necessary precautions to take during its administration. Furthermore, he discussed various types of wounds and the proper techniques for applying a slab to an injured part. Mr. Mittar concluded with a discussion on shock, its signs, symptoms, and management.

In the afternoon session, Mr. Rajbir Dalal gave an informative talk on fire safety and its first aid. He introduced the golden rule of ABC (Airway, Breathing, Circulation) and discussed the different types and levels of fire. Mr. Dalal also addressed the common causes of domestic fires and strategies for their prevention. The session included a live demonstration on how to control fire from gas cylinders commonly used in households. To make the session interactive, he also demonstrated the functioning of the fire brigade and its approach to controlling various types of fires.



27. Poster Making & Slogan Writing competition on the theme: Yoga & Health on 19.06.2024 at Student's Activity Centre

In preparation for the upcoming Yoga Day, a poster-making and slogan-writing competition was held today at the Student Activity Center of Maharshi Dayanand University.
