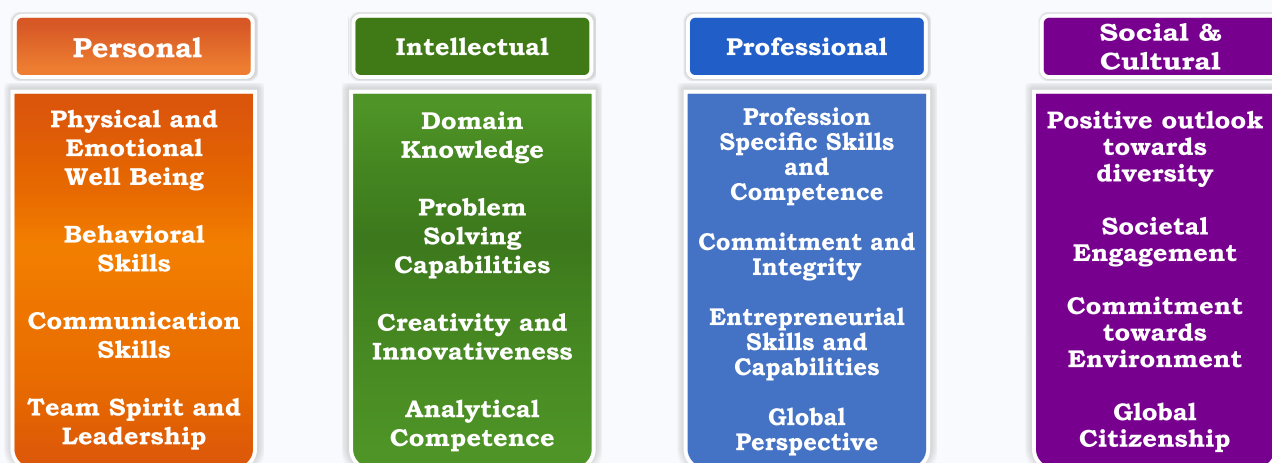

KNOW YOUR UNIVERSITY

Introduction

Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak is a State University established under Haryana Act No. 25 of 1975 with the objective to promote inter-disciplinary Higher Education and Research with special emphasis on studies of environmental, ecology and life sciences. The University offers 187 Programs through 11 faculties comprising 42 University Teaching Departments/Centers/Institutes and a satellite campus at MDU-CPAS, Gurugram. Blooming flowers in the Rose Garden, well-paved sidewalks, carefully pruned plants along both sides of the campus roads, abundant greenery, and the resulting eco-friendly ambience give a majestic look to our clean, green and eco-friendly campus.

The University has been:

- Awarded Grade A+ by NAAC with CGPA of 3.44 in its 3rd cycle.
- Ranked 46th among State Public Universities in India in NIRF 2025 by MHRD, Government of India.
- Granted Green Institutional Mentor Award by MHRD in 2020.

The University is marching ahead with determined efforts to achieve academic excellence. Well Qualified, Experienced and Hardworking Faculty, transparent, dynamic and responsible administrative set-up, strategic academic and research linkages at national and international level is instrumental in delivering quality education, with decisive focus on upliftment of women and rural students, and a sense of commitment to contribute its might to social, community, and national cause.

The Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE), originally established as a correspondence cell in 1988, contributes significantly towards achieving the national objective of providing quality education to one and all by fulfilling its motto to reach the unreached by offering distance education programs to learners belonging to different parts of the State/Country. Various programs offered by the Centre range from conventional to professional as per demographic needs and enhance employment opportunities.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources.

The University has enormous physical infrastructure to support the teaching- learning activities. The campus is spread over 622 acres with a built-up area of 3,75,000 sq. meters, with 19 teaching blocks, 279 classrooms, 177 departmental laboratories, Central Animal House and Aryabhata Central Instrumentation Laboratory. The University has created state-of-art infrastructure for

sports activities for students that include a fully air-conditioned Multipurpose Gymnasium, Cricket Stadium and Swimming Pool, Synthetic Athletics track, Lawn Tennis courts, Boxing Hall, Wrestling Hall, Kabaddi Hall, Squash Hall, Sports Hostel etc.

The University library, named after the revered social reformer Swami Vivekananda, offers a highly conducive and enabling academic environment. It functions as an effective knowledge treasury both for the Students and Teachers. Strategically located Vivekananda Library with excellent state-of-the-art facilities is housed in a magnificent 3-storeyed building with 1,10,000 sq. ft. carpet area and a seating capacity of 3000 users, a separate air-conditioned reading hall for the researchers. It has an air-conditioned Internet Lab with 58 PCs, 1Gbps bandwidth Internet connectivity, and a multimedia library with 20 PCs. The application of RFID technology for self-check-out check-in with security gates has been implemented and the CCTV system for library security is in operation.

The University has best-in-class ICT infrastructure to promote research, and e- Governance. The University Computer Centre houses a data center having 16 Blade Servers (Dual CPU – 16 to 24 core, with up to 256 GB RAM on each server) hosting more than 50 Virtual servers with more than 600 TB of SAN/unified storage. The servers run on Windows Server datacenter edition in high availability mode. A Unified Threat Management Solution has been implemented to secure the network from hackers, for filtering unnecessary traffic, streamlining traffic by specifying priorities and blocking unwanted sites on the 1G Internet connectivity provided by NKN using Forti Gate 1500D, supported by Forti Analyzer 1000D. The Internal LAN having a backbone speed of 10G is governed by the best-in- class (for a university) core switch. Cisco unified communication infrastructure has been implemented in the university. Online meeting facilities are being extensively used for online classes and virtual meetings.

The need for digital initiatives has become imperative in view of new technological developments as society is becoming more tech-savvy. The University has a full-fledged Digital Learning Centre which reviews/curates and monitors the use of digital learning resources and suggests ways and initiatives to improve the proper utilization of these resources for effective teaching and learning. The university has created its own Learning Management System (LMS) that facilitates university students with free and open access to all LMS resources (Presentations/Documents/PDF files/Videos, etc.) developed and uploaded by the faculty members of the University.

Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

Maharshi Dayanand University, a fast-growing hub of wide range of programs in the traditional, professional and job-oriented streams, consistently endeavors to improve and strengthen the system and procedures related to Teaching-Learning and Evaluation. The University has an application-oriented programs through internship, projects, field work etc. The academic programs are designed and developed to fulfill the vision and mission of the University taking into account the feedback obtained from various stakeholders (Students, Parents, Alumni, Teachers and Employer) as well adhering to Regulatory requirements (as per guidelines of regulatory bodies like AICTE, PCI, BCI and NCTE wherever applicable).

Effective curriculum delivery is attained through well planned and documented process. Academic Council, Board of Studies and other academic committees work in coordination to strengthen curricular, co-curricular extracurricular activities. Implementation of National Education Policy (2020) offers greater academic flexibility to enhance employability skills of the students by integrating discipline specific, interdisciplinary/multidisciplinary electives in curricula to meet students' interests and aspirations. Programs relevant to Gender Sensitivity, Professional Ethics, Human Values and Community Outreach are also integrated in relevant programs. Environmental issues and its sustainability are an integral part of most of the UG/PG programs. Value-added Certificate Courses inculcate research aptitude, soft skills, personality development and life skills to keep students conversant with current global scenario resulting in the overall holistic development of the students. Timely conduct of examinations and declaration of results in accordance with the pre-determined schedule is an important part of evaluation process.

Research and Innovation

The University has a state of the art academic and research facilities and financial support system to promote Research. During the last five years, Research Projects/Schemes programs worth more than Rs. 50 Crores were funded by Government and non- government agencies. University Teaching Departments have received financial grants from various funding agencies under UGC-SAP, CAS, DST-FIST, DBT, ICSSR etc. in the last five year. With a view to promote research, the University provides approximately 152 University Research Scholarships to 42 departments every year. In addition, fifteen more University Research Scholarships are exclusively meant for SC category students. The University has well defined "Research Promotion Policy" to promote research culture among the Faculty and Research scholars. The University has "Code of Ethics for

Academic Integrity and Plagiarism” to promote quality research and to check malpractices and Plagiarism.

The University has National and International level strategic tie-ups with academic and research organizations for joint academic and research programs and 15 MoUs have already been signed. Recently University has also signed MoU with National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) to provide skill development avenues to the University students and with Global Village Foundation (GVF) for collaborative work in Higher Education, Policy Planning and Social issues.

Central Animal House facilitates the research on Mice, Rat, Rabbit etc. as per the guidelines of Institutional Animal Ethics Committee (IAEC) in air conditioned and calm environment. The University also has Institutional Human Ethics Committee (IHEC) to meet standards of research where human participations is involved. To facilitate the research environment of Science Departments, the University has set up Aryabhata Central Instrumentation Laboratory with a large number of sophisticated scientific and analytical instruments.

Research Institutes/Centers and Chairs

Ch. Ranbir Singh Institute of Social and Economic Change promote and conducts interdisciplinary research to achieve sustainable development goals; organizes seminars and symposia, conferences, workshops, and extension lectures in areas of larger social, cultural and economic concerns; carry out documentation of research studies in order to disseminate knowledge, thereby capacity building of research scholars and young faculty.

Faculty Development Centre (FDC) of the University developed under Pandit Madan Mohan Malviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching (PMMNMTT) contributes significantly towards the accomplishment of the University Vision and Mission.

Women Studies Centre seeks to strengthen individual and institutional efforts to enable Women empowerment in the society by engaging in micro-level field studies and organizing awareness programs. It actively collaborates with academia, government establishments and civil society to have broader perspective on wider issues concerning women in India in general and Haryana in particular. Women’s Studies Centre also strives to disseminate knowledge among different strata of society by promoting dialogue between academia and activists, social work and policy making.

The Centre for Haryana Studies, focuses on cultural, social, economic and political aspects of Haryana State. It seeks to strengthen the governance through action research, capacity building and to work in close cooperation with the State Government. By taking up relevant research

agenda it provides all important inputs to the policy makers at different levels of the government. Pt. Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Centre of Excellence for Rural Development works towards issues to raise the quality of life of people.

The University has established 10 Chairs commemorating the names of thinkers and eminent personalities with the aim to promote and conduct quality research on the life, work and philosophy of social thinkers, reformers, and educationists.

Student Support Services

The University has a very conducive, student centric, ragging free and supportive environment where students of diverse sections of the society come to pursue higher education. The University has a well-established financial and non-financial student support system and has provided financial support approximately 10000 students in last five year under various government and non-government fellowships schemes. Additionally, the University has offered various capability enhancement schemes for personal, interpersonal and professional development of the students and for better job opportunities. These efforts have provided job opportunities in various sectors to more than 4000 students. As an initiative towards safety-security of girl students, the University has a proactive cell for Prevention of Violence and Sexual Harassment against Women, 24x7 CCTV surveillance check and security checks.

The Directorate of Sports of the University has the distinction of producing a large number of sportspersons of national and international repute including several Arjuna and Bheem Awardees who brought laurels not only to the University and the State, but to the Nation as well. For harnessing the potential of the youth and promoting sports, it organizes coaching camps for Players participating Inter-University and World University Games.

M.D. University is proud of its rich Sports culture and has created a world class Sports infrastructure and engaged competent trainers/coaches to nurture the talent of the students. Around 250 Students of the University has represented the State and the country in National, Commonwealth, Asian and Olympics during the last Eight years. The position holders are honored with handsome cash incentive prizes every year by end of the session.

The University has established a Students' Activity Centre. The building houses, Dean Students' Welfare office, a book shop, cybercafé, canteen, common rooms for boys & girls, a mini gym, indoor games facilities. The Students' Welfare Department offers merit scholarship to the previous

year Toppers of the class, Overall, Topper of the Program and Need-cum-Merit scholarship to the Undergraduate and Post Graduate students. The DSW office also offers financial support to the students through various schemes such as 'Sahyog Scheme', 'Earn While Learn' and 'Smarth Scheme' for Divyang apart from Group Insurance of each enrolled student of UTD. The Department also operates eco-friendly battery-operated vehicles in the Campus. The Department also organizes various co-curricular activities related to fine arts, literary; cultural activities, theatre and adventure sports, trekking, youth leadership and training, rock climbing, snow skiing, value based spiritual and personality development camps etc. To ensure holistic development of the students admitted to various programs in the UTDs and MDU-CPAS, the University has created more than 20 students' clubs to harness the talent in different domains of student activities. The spectrum of such activities extends from oratory skills, photography etc. to culinary skills encompassing almost every field of interest.

Students' Welfare Department has established a Youth Centre for Skill Development. The Centre organizes batches for enhancing communication and soft skills of the students by providing guidance for SSB interview for selection in the Armed Forces. Since its establishment, the Centre has facilitated placement of students in Officer Rank in the Armed Forces. The SC/ST Cell has been established by the University to ensure the effective implementation of the Reservation Policy in admission and allotment of Hostels etc. and to address the grievances of the members of SC/ST communities, functioning under the overall supervision of the Liaison Officer, the cell works for the welfare of SC/ST candidates. The Cell endeavors to ensure the benefit of Central Government/ State Government policies reaches the SC/ST students.

Scholarships

The University provides financial assistance to the meritorious and needy students in the form of:

- a) Scholarships like National Scholarship Portal, University Merit Scholarship, University Research Scholarship, Haryana State Merit Scholarship, Post Matric Scholarship for the SC/BC categories students, Merit-cum-Means Scholarship, Reimbursement of Tuition Fee & Transport Facility to Schedule Castes, Free Books For SC Students, State Merit Scholarship To Under Graduate Girls, Haryana State Meritorious Incentives Scheme, Haryana State Meritorious Incentives Scheme (CBSE), State Merit Scholarship To UG/PG Students, Lower Income Group Scheme, LPS Scholarship & LPS Bossard Scholarship, Lion Joseph McLoughl in Scholarship, Sh. Bimal Prashad Jain Memorial Scholarship, Dr. Rajesh Malhotra Memorial Scholarship and Medals, Dr. Sarojini Devi Memorial

Scholarship, Dr. P.P. Singh Memorial Scholarship, Ch. Badlu Ram Scholarship, Sh. K.C. Shastri Charitable Trust Scholarship, Mr. Devesh Mehra Memorial Scholarship, Sh. Prem Avtar Sharma Memorial Scholarship, Sh. R. K. Deswal Memorial Scholarship, Late Sh. Kameshwar Prasad Memorial Award, Sh. Manohar Lal Gogna Award, Late Sh. - b) Medals like Sh. Lachmandas Garg Gold Medals, Sita Ram Jindal Foundation Gold Medal and Late Sh. Kameshwar Parsad Silver Medal.
- c) Stipends like Consolidated Stipend Scheme For SC, Consolidated Stipend Scheme for Grand Children of Freedom Fighters, Post Graduate Stipends and General Stipends.

The University has a full-fledged Centre for International Academic Affairs which acts as a Nodal Agency and assists the foreign student community for admission to various programs, visa requirements and their overall welfare through a unique 'single window system'. M.D. University, Rohtak is also recognized as an authorized partner Institute of "Study in India" (Institute ID: SII-I-0252) – Initiative by Ministry of HRD, Government of India.

The Career Counseling and Placement Cell of the University organize seminars and workshops for students about the emerging professional trends and events, job profiles, leadership roles, entrepreneurship, market needs and risks. Training is also imparted through workshops related to communication skills, personality development, resume writing, confidence building, preparing for interview etc. Eminent industrialists, HR personnel and expert from different fields are invited for delivering lectures and helping the students regarding latest market requirements and trends in the job market.

The University Guidance and Counseling Cell provide Guidance and Counselling, Morale Boosting and Promotional Services thereby ensuring positive health. The Cell also provides Educational and Vocational guidance, in addition to catering to the psychological needs of the students. The conducive academic environment, excellent support of University Centre for Competitive Examination has enabled a large number of students to qualify various national level examinations, as well as to pursue higher studies.

The Anti-Ragging Committee, Grievances Redressal Cell and Anti Sexual Harassment Cell of the University ensure that the grievances and complaints regarding sexual harassment etc. are addressed timely. The University Haat and the University Health Centre to cater the daily needs and medical care of students respectively.

The University provides Residential accommodation on the campus to over 5000 students in 20 hostels (Ten each for girls and boys). Maintenance of the hostel complexes and provision of hygienic food at reasonable charges always remains the top priority of the University authorities. All hostels have been provided with Wi-Fi internet connectivity apart from recreation rooms.

Governance

Competent leadership at different levels of the University with a well-defined system support and organizational structure enhances the academic and administrative effectiveness by ensuring that the action plans are specifically aligned to the vision and mission of the University. The University follows decentralized and participative management approach in all kinds of academic and administrative activities. Every activity of the University is governed by the Act, Statutes and Ordinances. Recruitments/promotions are made as per the established and transparent process. The grievances are attended promptly. E-governance has been implemented in almost all areas of operation. The University's bodies/cells/ committees function effectively.

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), established as per guidelines of NAAC, acts as a beacon of quality assurance and maintenance of academic standards with respect to various important functional requirements. The IQAC acts as a nodal agency for ushering in the era of total quality management by working out intervention strategies to enhance overall quality in the institution. Various quality initiatives like Academic and Administrative Audit of UTDs, collection and analysis of stakeholder's feedback report etc. are routinely incorporated as healthy decision-making inputs for enhancing academic quality by the IQAC. IQAC promotes good academic ideas and practices. It seeks to work for planning, implementing, and measuring the outcome of academic, research and administrative performance of the institution.

Moral Values and Societal Contribution

Maharshi Dayanand University named after iconic social reformer Maharshi Dayanand, promotes humanitarian, nationalistic, socially-inclusive ethical Values along with developing scientific and modern temperament. The University actively organizes numerous outreach programs in collaboration with industry and Non-Government Organizations. The University fervently celebrates all important days of national importance and birth/death anniversaries of great Indian

personalities. Various activities/events are organized to promote universal values, national values, human values, communal and social cohesion, and national integration.

Fulfilling its commitment towards the society, the University has launched several Outreach initiatives and programs in order to inculcate awareness about important social issues. To connect the Higher Educational Institutes to village residents for awareness generation towards various social issues, government schemes, self-reliance & self- development and to train and enable local people to assume community responsibilities etc., Maharshi Dayanand University Rohtak has adopted five villages of Rohtak District namely Ballab, Baniyani, Bhali Anandpur, Maroudi Jattan and Maroudi Rangran. These villages are adopted under Unnat Bharat Abhiyyan Program of Government of India. The University NSS and YRC provides an opportunity to the students to devote part of their time to the service of humanity. It trains the volunteers by organizing workshops relating to disaster management, rescue operations and how to save themselves and others in calamities (natural or man-made). Volunteers are trained through health and hygiene workshop, how to keep themselves healthy and also expect them to convey this to the masses.

The University has successfully established an Environmental Sustainability Management Cell to take care of waste management issues. In order to generate awareness about waste management, the cell organizes various activities in the form of seminars, conferences, poster presentations, etc. highlighting the issues of environmental pollutants and their remedies, environmental sustainability, climate changes, green renewal energy systems, etc.

CENTRE FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE EDUCATION

Realizing the important role of education in National development, the Maharshi Dayanand University established a Correspondence Cell in 1988 for imparting education through 'Correspondence Course' leading to the award of B.Ed. degree. The University, with the passage of time and development of technology and requirement of society, upgraded the Correspondence Cell to the Directorate of Distance Education (DDE) in 1992 and expanded tremendously to offer a wide spectrum of courses through a network of Study Centres. With the amendment in the Maharshi Dayanand University Act in the year 2012, the Directorate restricted delivery of its courses to distance and online learners from its Headquarters and has been providing opportunities for higher education to a large segment of population especially deprived groups living in remote and rural areas, housewives and working people. From April 2022, the Directorate of Distance Education (DDE) was renamed the Centre for Distance and Online Education (CDOE).

The Centre for Distance and Online Education is organized into various sections and is housed in a spacious, easily accessible building equipped to support its academic and administrative functions. As a leading educational institution of the State, the Centre strives to create, preserve, and disseminate knowledge to build competitive capability for holistic development of man and society. The various programs offered by the CDOE range from conventional to professional as per need of the area and employment opportunities available in the country. In order to meet the growing demand of open and distance learning, the CDOE has acquired resources for access to rural areas and is contributing significantly towards achieving the national objective of providing quality education to all and to reach the unreached by offering useful ODL/Online Mode programs to learners belonging to different parts of the State/Country. The programs offered include Undergraduate Programs, Postgraduate Programs, and Certificate Courses. These programs are based on a carefully designed curriculum, well-planned teaching-learning strategies, an effective student support system, and a fair examination and evaluation system. Further, the Centre for Internal Quality Assurance has been established for maintenance of academic standards in distance education as per provisions of DEB (UGC) Regulations, 2020.

The CDOE believes in providing full support and service to its students, ensuring prompt removal of difficulties so that the participation of the students in the programs offered by the CDOE becomes really effective and meaningful. Candidates facing any difficulty in pursuing ODL/Online programs may either contact concerned officer/official during working hours or through email/letter. While making correspondence with the CDOE, student must mention his/her name, father's name, CDOE Student ID/Registration Number, Session, Class, Subject, Complete address etc. failing which the CDOE will not be able to reply to such communications/redressal of the grievance.

The Centre for Distance and Online Education has evolved the concept of “Student Support Services Camps (SSSCs)” to help and groom the distance and online learners in several ways. Student Support Service in open and distance learning system is quite different from other services and are not only confined to interactive counselling or solving the learner’s problems but also include to promote distance learning to address the issue of continuous upgradation of skills so as to produce manpower resources of the kind and the number required by society, to fulfill the expectations indicated in the National Education Policy. In addition to the services already mentioned, the focus of the educators is also on learners’ personality development, inculcating soft-skills, career counseling & guidance and community education. Further, the SSSCs are aimed to facilitate learning, counselling and to solve the problems of the distance and online learners which they face during their self-study from the self learning material provided by CDOE. Through SSSCs, the learners get an opportunity to interact with the counsellors and the peer group.

Facilities:

- The self-learning with the help of self learning material is supplemented by organizing Student Support Services Camps to solve the problems of the distance and online learners. During the duration of these camps students after getting himself/herself registered are free to contact the Counsellor(s) of the concerned program and get his/her doubts or problems resolved.
- The CDOE has a well-equipped Library along with a Reading Hall, Information and Communication Technology Laboratory, Computer Laboratory, Committee cum Video Conferencing Room and Seminar Hall.
- The University in collaboration with the Haryana Government's Department of Employment is running an Employment Information and Guidance Bureau to assist the students in making choice of career and courses. The students of the CDOE also can take full advantage of the facilities available at the Guidance Bureau.

Master of Arts (Public Administration) (ODL & Online Mode): Bachelor Degree in any discipline with at least 45% marks in aggregate (42.75% marks for SC/ST/ Blind/ Visually and Differently Abled candidates of Haryana only) or any other examination recognized by M.D. University, Rohtak as equivalent thereto.

Master of Arts (History) (ODL & Online Mode): Bachelor Degree in any discipline with at least 45% marks in aggregate (42.75% marks for SC/ST/ Blind/ Visually and Differently Abled candidates of Haryana only) or any other examination recognized by M.D. University, Rohtak as equivalent thereto.

Certificate Course in German Language (ODL & Online Mode): Senior Secondary Examination (10+2) with at least 50% marks (47.50% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/ Differently abled etc. candidates of Haryana only) form Board of School Education Haryana, Bhiwani or any other examination recognized by MDU, Rohtak as equivalent thereto.

Certificate Course in French Language (ODL & Online Mode): Senior Secondary Examination (10+2) with at least 50% marks (47.50% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/ Differently abled etc. candidates of Haryana only) form Board of School Education Haryana, Bhiwani or any other examination recognized by MDU, Rohtak as equivalent thereto.

Certificate Course in Spanish Language (ODL & Online Mode): Senior Secondary Examination (10+2) with at least 50% marks (47.50% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/ Differently abled etc. candidates of Haryana only) form Board of School Education Haryana, Bhiwani or any other examination recognized by MDU, Rohtak as equivalent thereto.

Certificate Course in Communication Skills in English (ODL & Online Mode): Senior Secondary Examination (10+2) with at least 50% marks (47.50% in case of SC/ST/Blind/Visually/ Differently abled etc. candidates of Haryana only) form Board of School Education Haryana, Bhiwani or any other examination recognized by MDU, Rohtak as equivalent thereto.

B.A./B.Com. Second Semester and onwards: The candidate shall be treated as promoted to the next semester/class automatically unless detained from appearing in an examination on any genuine ground(s).

M.A. (Hindi/Sanskrit/English/Political Science/Public Administration/Economics/History/Journalism & Mass Communication)/M.Com./M.Sc. (Mathematics) Second Semester and onwards: The candidate shall be treated as promoted to the next semester/class automatically unless detained from appearing in an examination on any genuine ground(s).

3. Students Intake for Different Programs, Criteria for Preparing Merit List and Reservation of Seats

- i. There is no limit for intake of students in all UG/PG programs except Master of Science (Mathematics). The intake for Master of Science (Mathematics) ODL/ Online program shall be limited as per DEB (UGC) Regulations.
- ii. The Merit List for admission to Master of Science (Mathematics) ODL/Online program shall be prepared on the basis of the academic merit (Percentage of marks in qualifying examination) and Reservation Policy notified by the Govt. of Haryana from time to time.
- iii. In case, the enrollment of students is less than five in a given program, such programs will not be offered in that session and refund of fee shall be as per applicable rules.

CHAPTER-II

INSTRUCTIONS/GUIDELINES FOR FILLING ONLINE APPLICATION FORM FOR ADMISSION

1. Before filing up of online application, the candidate must read the **Prospectus, Eligibility Requirements, Instructions and Regulations carefully** and then start the process of “**New Registration**”.
2. The candidate must carefully check and follow the steps/procedure mentioned in the user manual available on the website/portal before filling the application form (<https://mdu.ac.in> and / or <https://ddemduadm.samarth.edu.in/>)
3. Pre-requisites for applying online:
 - Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) ID and Digi-Locker account.
For this purpose, the candidates may visit the websites: <https://www.abc.gov.in> or <https://www.digilocker.gov.in>
 - After generating the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) ID the candidates are also required to visit Distance Education Bureau website (i.e. <https://deb.ugc.ac.in/StudentDEBId>) and create DEB ID (using ABC ID) after that the candidate may apply for admission in ODL/OL Programs offered by the Centre for Distance and Online Education.
 - For OTP verification & communication, the candidate must have a valid E-mail id and Mobile number.
 - The Candidate must have a scanned copy of Photograph and Signature (.jpeg only), Govt. issued identifier (Aadhar Card/PAN Card/Voter ID), Educational Qualifications (like Matriculation, Senior Secondary Examination, and Qualifying Examination etc.)

 - The candidates must also upload the proof of conversion formula from CGPA to Percentage, wherever applicable. The candidates are required to fill up the percentage of marks secured in each examination using the formula as before, wherever applicable.
 - After uploading of documents the candidate must check/view and ensure that correct documents are uploaded as mentioned in the Prospectus.
4. The candidate must select the Program carefully for which he/she is eligible to apply. The University will, in no way, be responsible for any wrong selection of the choice exercised.
5. The candidate must fill Social Category & Locality (Urban/Rural) in the Online Application Form.

CHAPTER-III

REGULATIONS GOVERNING ODL/ONLINE PROGRAMS

1. Admissions

- A. The candidate must read the Prospectus of CDOE carefully and visit the website of the University (www.mdu.ac.in) before filling up the Online Application form and follow the instructions. No change will be allowed in the candidate's name, father's name, mother's name and date of birth after submission of online admission form and fee. Candidate is further advised to remain in touch with the CDOE/University website for various information/instructions. However, the correction may be permitted subject to submission of written request of the candidate alongwith documentary proof upto 30 days from the last date of admission.
- B. The admissions will be made only on the basis of certificates issued by the recognized Board/University. No admission even provisional shall be made on the basis of certificates issued by the Principal of a School/College.
- C. In case the documents, on the basis of which provisional admission is granted are found to be fake, the provisional admission will be summarily rejected and the fee submitted by the student will be forfeited.
- D. All documents are required to be either in English or in English transcript of the same duly issued by the competent authority.
- E. Admission fees shall be accepted only through Online Admission portal.
- F. While making correspondence with the CDOE relating to the admission/remission of fees etc. candidate must mention his/her CDOE Student ID/Registration Number, Name, Father's name, Session, Class, Subject, Complete address etc. failing which the CDOE shall not be able to reply to such communication/redress the grievance.
- G. In case of non-payment of dues/fee or part thereof or any required document(s) to determine the eligibility, the candidature of an applicant is liable to be cancelled. However, it can be restored during the session on payment of balance dues with late fee and the required documents along with restoration fee, as the case may be, as prescribed by the University from time to time.
- H. The date on which fee/required document(s) actually received from the candidate in the Centre for Distance and Online Education will be treated the date of payment of fee/receipt of required document(s) etc.
- I. The acceptance of application form/admission fee, allotment of Registration No., permission to attend Students Support Services Camps etc. will be provisional and subject to the confirmation of eligibility.
- J. The Degree of foreign Universities shall be considered provisionally subject to issuance of Equivalence Certificate by the Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi within one month of admission. If AIU does not issue Equivalence Certificate for specific

program the Equivalence Committee of MDU shall consider such cases and decide the equivalency.

K. Admission to the program offered by the CDOE will be allowed to such candidate who is eligible as per provisions of the Ordinance/Prospectus and submitted:

- a) Complete Online Application Form and fee.
- b) Uploaded scanned copy of original required certificates/document(s)
 - i) UG Program: DMC of Matriculation & Senior Secondary/10+2 (Result Copy of concerned Board) *.
 - ii) PG Program: DMC of Matriculation, Senior Secondary/10+2 and Graduation (Result Copy of concerned University) *.
 - iii) Fee Concession Certificate, if any.
 - iv) Aadhar Card/Voter ID Card/PAN Card.
 - v) Passport (in case of Foreign Student).
- c) The candidate must generate Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) ID and fill ABC ID and Digi-Locker Account in Online Application Form.

* The candidate who has uploaded the internet generated Result Copy of the concerned Board/University are required to submit copy of Detailed Marks Card (DMC) within 30 days from the last date of admission failing which late fee will be charged.

L. The candidate is required to seek online admission/re-registration to odd semesters i.e. First, Third and Fifth (as the case may be) of the concerned program along with annual fees and the students are not required to pay fee for even semesters i.e. Second, Fourth, Sixth.

M. Late admission of a candidate is not a right for postponement of holding SSSCs, submission of assignments, postponement of examination/fresh examination, etc.

N. The candidate should ensure timely submission of all required documents and fees, failing which it will be the sole responsibility of the candidate for any consequences.

O. No migration certificate is required to be submitted by the candidate, including candidate who has passed his/her examinations from any foreign Board/University. However, foreign candidate shall be admitted only on issuance of equivalence certificate by the Association of Indian Universities/ the Equivalence Committee of MDU and No Objection Certificate issued by the Dean, Centre for International Academic Affairs, M.D. University, Rohtak and deposit of prescribed fee for the purpose.

P. The candidate must fill his/her correct email-ID and mobile Number in the online application form and change of address, mobile number and email ID, if any, must be communicated immediately by mentioning his/her name, father's name, class, session, CDOE Regn. No. etc. to the Centre for Distance and Online Education failing which the CDOE will not be able to communicate.

- Q. A student of first Semester of any program may be permitted to change subject(s) or Program upto the last date of admission by depositing the prescribed fee for change of Subject/Program. A student can pursue two academic programs, one in full time physical mode and another in Open and Distance Learning (ODL)/Online mode; or upto two ODL/Online Programs simultaneously.
- R. The students who are pursuing any of the programs in Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak as a regular and unable to continue as such on account of employment or any justified reason shall be allowed admission in same UG/PG program in 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th Semester (as the case may be) being run by the CDOE provided that the Scheme of Examinations and Syllabus is same in regular mode program.
- S. **The admission may be rejected under the following circumstances:**
- I. The candidate having passed qualifying examination from the self-styled Universities/Institutes/Boards, declared bogus/fake by the UGC and other Govt. bodies, shall not be eligible for admission to any program of CDOE. The list of such Universities/Institutes is available at Appendix D. The list may vary from time to time as per notifications issued by the University Grants Commission & other Govt. bodies;
 - II. Original Certificate of qualifying examination is not produced in the Centre for Distance and Online Education in stipulated time/on demand;
 - III. The application form is incomplete or the required documents/photographs are not uploaded at the time of submission of online form/fee;
 - IV. Required fee is not remitted in full;
 - V. Name of papers/Correct options are not opted in the Application Form at the time of submission of Online Admission Form/Fee.
 - VI. If a candidate gives false statement or submits false/incorrect document(s), the fee/dues already paid by him/her shall be forfeited and such candidate shall have no claim for admission or refund of fee.
 - VII. The student having reappear in qualifying examination will not be considered for admission to any program.
- Note:** In case the admission of any candidate is cancelled due to deficiency of documents at the time of uploading, the admission of such candidate may however, be revived if otherwise eligible at the time of admission on submission of the requisite document(s) and fee as applicable before the commencement of examination of theory papers.
- T. The student is advised to bring his/her Identity Card issued by the CDOE whenever he/she visits the CDOE.

- a) The fee for the UG/PG programs (for the concerned academic session) will be deposited through Online Admission Portal of University/CDOE only and no separate intimation will be sent for payment of fee.
- b) In case of revision of various fees, etc. during the academic session, the students will have to pay the difference in fee structure, etc.

(III) REFUND OF FEE

a) The Refund of Fee is permissible only:

- i) In case applicant submits admission form duly complete in all respects but is declared NOT ELIGIBLE for not fulfilling the eligibility conditions.
- ii) In case an amount deposited in excess of prescribed fee;
- iii) In case of demise of a candidate before the commencement of examinations without having appeared in any paper;
- iv) In case a candidate deposits/remits fee with the CDOE which is not related to his/her admission or the admission form of a candidate is not entertained being time-barred.
- v) In case, where the enrolment in the program is less than 5 students.

b) The fee remitted by the applicant shall not be refunded if:

- i) the admission of an applicant is not finalised due to non-payment of fee/dues and other charges or a part thereof by the prescribed date.
- ii) the applicant fails to submit the required certificate(s)/document(s) in the stipulated time or the certificate(s)/ document(s) submitted by him/her are found incorrect/false/fake.
- iii) after being admitted to the course, the candidate does not want to continue his/her studies on any personal grounds;
- iv) the candidature of a student is cancelled for non-submission of required fees and document(s).
- v) a student who does not appear in the examination after the issue of Roll No. and the fee paid by him/her will not be adjusted, even if he/she seeks admission to that/than/another course.

Note:

1. *Fee of the candidate covered in any of the above a) ('i' to 'iv') provisions will be refunded after a deduction of 20% or as decided by the University. No fee will be refunded if the candidate has supplied fake documents or stated wrong facts in the admission form or failed to supply the required documents/information in time.*
2. *Refund in any case will be subject to provisions notified by the Regulatory Body and adopted by the University.*
3. *In case the request of a candidate for change of subject/course/option/revival of candidature is not acceded to, for any reason whatsoever, the fee paid by him/her for change of subject/course/option/revival of candidature will be refunded after deducting 20% of the amount in question on receipts of written request from the candidate.*

(IV) FEE CONCESSION FOR THE PROGRAMS OTHER THAN CERTIFICATE COURSES

- i) Fifty Percent (50%) concession in Tuition/Student Support Services Fee & Self Learning Material will be admissible to the following categories of students seeking admission in Open and Distance Learning Programs:

- a) Working Defence Personnel up to the level of JCO who are not getting any scholarship or fee concession and/or any financial assistance from his/her employer.
- b) Scheduled Castes/Tribes of Haryana only on production of required certificate.
- ii) Hundred Percent (100%) concession in Tuition/Students Support Services Fee will be admissible to Maharshi Dayanand University employee or his/her Ward/Spouse.

3. REGISTRATION OF STUDENTS

The Centre for Distance and Online Education, consequent upon the admission of students to the courses offered by the University, through ODL/Online Mode will validate the online submitted details and finally allot the Registration Number to each student, and detailed record will be maintained for the registered students. The student whenever makes any correspondence with the CDOE is required to indicate his/her Registration Number.

4. SELF LEARNING MATERIAL

Each student admitted to a course offered by the CDOE will be provided self learning material (soft/hard copy in English/Hindi medium as per availability). The students may also consult books prescribed/recommended at the end of the relevant syllabi to enlarge scope of learning.

5. GRIEVANCE REDRESSAL CELL

The CDOE believes in providing full support and services to its students by ensuring the removal of difficulties, so that the programs offered by the CDOE becomes really effective and meaningful. In case a student faces any difficulty with regard to the concerned program, he/she may contact the concerned Official/Officer during working hours or through email/letter etc. If the problem/grievance is not redressed, he/she may bring the matter to the notice of the Director, CDOE. If the student still feels unsatisfied, he/she may submit his/her grievance to the Grievance Redressal Cell of the CDOE in writing mentioning his/her details i.e. Name/Father's name, Registration No. (Allotted by the CDOE), name of course (with year/semester), failing which the CDOE will not be able to redress the grievance. CHAPTER-IV EXAMINATIONS

[I] GENERAL INFORMATION

- a) The semester examination will be held in the months as under on such dates as may be notified by the Controller of Examinations:

No request for adjustment/ change in examination schedule of the University shall be entertained. The examinations of Online Mode Programs shall be held online.

- b) Admit Cards/ Roll Number slips for appearing in the University examination shall be provisional subject to the fulfilment of the eligibility conditions laid down in the Ordinance/Prospectus for ODL/Online Mode programs of the University. The date-sheet(s) and Roll Numbers/Admit cards of all eligible candidates will be uploaded on the University's website, normally 10 days before the commencement of examinations which can be downloaded by the candidate. If any candidate does not find his/ her Roll No./Admit Card on the website, he/she should contact the concerned section (UG or PG, as the case may be) of Centre for Distance and Online Education for issuance of duplicate Roll No. Slip/Admit card.
- c) No representation/request/correspondence will be entertained relating to the issue of non-receipt or availability of Roll Nos./Admit cards by post or on the website after the theory papers examinations are over and the candidate himself/herself shall be responsible for the consequences. In such cases, the request of candidate for refund/adjustment of fee paid by him/her or any claim for compensation or re-examination will not be considered by Centre for Distance and Online Education.
- d) The supplementary examinations of students having compartment/re-appear shall be held on the dates to be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- e) All rules and regulations of the University shall be applicable on the students pursuing ODL/Online Mode programs for matters not specifically covered above or in the regulations in question.

[II] INSTRUCTIONS FOR SUBMISSION OF AWARDS OF ASSIGNMENTS

- a) Submission of assignment for subject(s), wherever applicable, is mandatory by the students. The students will have to submit the same to the concerned assigned teacher through email with a copy to the dedicated e-mail to be created by the CDOE for this purpose, in order to have a record of submission of assignment by the students.
- b) The Assignment should be submitted by the students and the awards should be

supplied by the concerned SSSC/LSC according to the schedule.

- c) Thereafter, late fee of Rs. 25/- per subject per day shall be charged from the concerned student or the SSSC/LSC within 30 days after the last date of submission of Assignment or the submission of awards by the concerned teacher as the case may be.
- d) Assignment Awards shall not be entertained if the same are received in the University after 30 days i.e. after the closing date of Assignment and after declaration of results. However, the Controller of Examinations may condone the delay on merit of each case to accept such awards, with late fee, of Rs. 50/- per course per day subject to maximum of Rs. 2000/- per course per semester but not more than Rs. 5000/- taking all the courses together for that semester of a program) from the concerned student or from the concerned teacher, whosoever is at fault, but prior to the next semester examination.
- e) If still the assignment is not submitted by any student, he/she will be awarded zero marks against the assignment of subject; and if the awards are not submitted by the concerned teacher within the specified time after submission of assignment by the student, disciplinary action may be initiated against him/her.
- f) The concerned teachers must submit the awards within 10 days after the submission of assignment by the student in the cases where late fee is applicable.

[III] INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS PLACED UNDER RE-APPEAR/ COMPARTMENT & EX-STUDENTS

- a) A candidate who has completed the prescribed course of instructions and other requirements, such as, payment of full fee, submission of required documents, attended 75% SSSCs of his/her subject(s)/paper(s), including practical but does not appear in the examination, or fails or is placed under compartment/re-appear is allowed to appear/re-appear in the examination/paper(s) as per the conditions prescribed in the relevant Ordinance for passing the course.

The last date for submission of examination forms for appearing in the supplementary examinations for under-graduate/post-graduate programs will be notified by the Controller of Examinations on the University's website. If the result of a candidate is declared late, he/she can submit his/her form within 15 days of the declaration of the result. Candidates placed under Re-appear/compartment will submit his/her Examination Forms online on the website of the University. The Roll Numbers/Admit Cards and date-sheet(s) of ex-students will be available on the University website normally 10 days before the commencement of examinations.

- b) All enquiries regarding the payment of fee in respect of ex-students may be addressed to the Superintendent (Fee and Cash), Accounts Branch, Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak.
- c) The examination fee can be deposited to the University through online mode.

CHAPTER-V

STUDENTS' SUPPORT SERVICE CAMPS

Student Support Services in Open and Distance Learning system are not confined only to interactive counselling or solving the learners problems but also include the personality development, soft-skills, career counselling, community education, promoting open and distance learning as per the National Education Policy i.e. Education for all. The Centre for Distance and Online Education has devised the concept of Student Support Services Camps (SSSCs). The Centre for Distance and Online Education organizes SSSCs for solving the problems of ODL and Online learners with the help of well qualified counsellors for the programs being offered by it. The SSSCs facilitate learning, counselling and solve the problems of the enrolled learners which they face during their self-study from the self learning material supplied by the CDOE. Through SSSCs, learners get an opportunity to interact with the counsellors and their peer group. The learner will be allowed to appear in the examination only if he/she has attended not less than 75% of Student Support Services Camps of all the subject(s)/paper(s) opted by him/her.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR DISTANCE AND ONLINE LEARNERS:

1. The Learner Support/Student Support Services Camps are arranged for the benefit of students and it is mandatory for students to attend at least 75% of Learner Support /Student Support Services Camps of all the subject(s)/paper(s) opted by him/her failing which he/she will not be allowed to appear in the examination.
2. The soft copy of Self Learning Material of the concerned course is available on the University website and its hard copy (if available) can be collected from Centre for Distance and Online Education or during the SSSCs only on production of fee deposit receipt.
3. The students are required to visit the website of the University (www.mdu.ac.in) regularly for Schedule of LS/SSSCs and other related information.
4. According to the schedule notified, the students are advised to contact the concerned SSSC Coordinator.
5. The students are advised to make his/her own arrangement for boarding, lodging, notebooks, pen-pencil and other supporting equipments/connectivity etc. during the SSSCs.
6. Detailed program/timetable shall be made available by the concerned Program Coordinator/Local Facilitator on the first day of SSSC.
7. Change in the venue of the SSSCs, if any, shall be notified on the University's website.
8. The concerned Program Coordinator/Local Facilitator/Clerk/Contact person may be consulted for any clarification regarding the SSSCs.
