About MDU

MDU also maintains national and international academic collaborations, fostering holistic and inclusive student development.

About University Centre for Competitive Examinations



UCCE has organised coaching classes for written exams for IAS and Allied Services in the past in accordance with the original mandate of the UGC for this centre. This programme was expanded to include HCS and Allied Services and later on for many other written Examinations conducted by UPSC, HPSC, UGC and Banking Services Recruitment bodies. All these coaching programmes are being organised but the coaching programme for IAS/HCS and Allied Services could not continue for various

reasons. However, in view of the rising number of aspirants of our region these days, the programme with a multipronged and layered approach is being rolled out again. The Guidance, Counselling and Coaching for Civil Services Examination programme was approved by the Executive Council of MDU in its 301st Meeting held on 29 September 2025.

Why CSE Coaching Program?

Within the administrative set-up of our country, civil services form not only its basic structure but also provide uninterrupted and continuous governance. The civil servants along with the elected representatives occupy the centre of 'policy-making,' of course, non-bureaucratic specialists like academicians and technocrats also play a vital role. Civil servants transform the policies into action, administer the country and maintain law and order in the society. The fast pace of economic, technological, political, strategic, ecological and cultural changes in the society affected by geopolitics, geo-economics, globalization and nationalism call for civil servants to be well versed with all these areas both at the micro and the macro levels. They are required to be intellectually, ethically and emotionally sensitive and sound on the one hand, and to be highly skilled and trained, on the other hand. But more important, they need to be trainable and capable of learning new skills and concepts. Most young graduates, particularly those intending to make career in civil services, are aware of these issues. Given the mechanics and dynamics of the 'package' oriented corporatized world, the importance of the civil services has only increased and the increasing number of the aspirants is reflective of this awareness. The present Guidance, Counselling and Coaching Programme for Civil Services Examinations has been designed to help civil services aspirants to successfully negotiate the civil services examinations 2027 and in subsequent years.

Mechanics of the Coaching Program

1. Encourage and Motivate:


- (a) Interactions with young IAS and Allied Services officers
- (b) Interactions with serving and retired civil servants for extended interactions, guidance and counselling.
- (c) Coaching Program is open to all however the target group is students (current and former) of MDU Rohtak and other sister universities of Haryana.

2. Enrolment of Aspirants in the Batch:

All interested aspirants will be registered for an initial period of 14 days as day scholars at a nominal fee of Rs. 5000/-. During this period (01 to 14 February 2026) classes will be held and continuous evaluation will give an opportunity to the aspirants to measure their readiness to take CSE and also how to go ahead seriously. During this period, classes for 3/4 areas/topics of the GS will be held. At the end of this period a comprehensive screening test, mainly set on the areas/topics discussed, will be held to form the batch. This schedule ends with a 120 (30 + 90) minutes test on 16 Feb. 2026 to be followed by

discussions and feedback on the test and classes. The test will include both MCQs and descriptive questions. In addition, three more tests will be conducted: Qualifying Papers English & Hindi and Essay. The duration for these tests will be about 60 – 90 minutes each. The discussions will be both group and one-on-one basis.

3. Library Support



- (a) A ready list of relevant reading material with location of each source in the library for both print and the digital forms.
- (b) A dedicated digitally controlled entree hall with designated carrels and high speed wi-fi.
- (c) Issue of 4 Books for a week only for the carrel and two books for taking out of library for two weeks.

4. Resident Advisors/Counsellors

At least one advisor/counsellor will be available in the designated room in the Library on all working days for 2 hours to address general problems of the CSE aspirants and other topic/area specific advisors will be available on appointment basis.

Monthly tests on specific topics for Paper I and II of Preliminary and GS I to IV will be conducted for continuous evaluation and feedback.

5. Essay and Qualifying Papers in English and Hindi

(a) Short term remedial classes for the qualifying Language Papers for the candidates, who may require, will be organised in the initial phase of the coaching programme so that they may not interfere with the concerted effort of the candidates in the run up to the main examinations.

(b) Most candidates may need a sprucing up of their writing skills as they are required not only to write two long essays (100-1200 words each) in the Essay Paper but they also need to write many answers (may be loosely termed short essays) ranging from 100 words to 300 words in the GS Papers. The skills of composing essays will add to their abilities to communicate ideas more convincingly in a coherent manner in GS

Papers. The candidates will also be benefitted in a similar manner when it comes to write their answers in their Optional Subject Papers.

6. Lectures/talks/workshops

There are 7 major areas covered in Paper I, 3 main areas in Paper II of the Preliminary Examination and about 15 areas (common with Prelims.) in GS I to IV of the Main Examination. Largest number of lectures/talks/workshops will be devoted to 7 major areas of the Paper I (Prelims.) and 15 major areas of the GS I to IV of the Main examination. Three full length mock tests for Paper II (Prelims.) will be conducted and required number of classes will be conducted to support each aspirant to score > 50% in the Mock test to take care of the qualifying 33% marks in the UPSC examination.

7. Since the temporal window between the Preliminary and the Main Examinations is quite narrow and does not allow a significant intervention in the final stage of preparation (barely 8-10 weeks) for the Mains, the coaching programme has been designed to judiciously take care of all the three stages – Prelims, Mains and the Interview.

8. The main coaching programme for the batch will start from 23 February 2026 to the last week of January 2027 with suspension of classes for small durations as required.



9. About 1000 lectures/talks/classes of one hour duration addressing both the Preliminary and the Main examinations will be held in all. Classes will be held in smart classrooms. Soft copies of the lecture notes and reference material suggested by experts in digital form will be provided.

10. Experienced and area/topic specialists from MDU and outside have already been taken onboard.

11. Guidance, counselling and reading material will be arranged for all optional subjects though the coaching/classroom teaching will be dedicated to common papers. This guidance and counselling will be mainly offline but given the nature of the optional subject it might be only online.

12. Mock Interviews by a five member board with a detailed feedback to the candidate will be held at suitable time.

13. Fortnightly MCQ tests in February, March and April 2027 and descriptive tests in June, July and August 2027 will be held for Preliminary and Main examinations.

14. Fee for the coaching programme: Rs. 80,000/-



15. Hostel Charges: as applicable for different hostel facilities. For hostels (Boys) annual charges are about 18000/- including about 8000/- refundable security and meals cost about 4000/- a month. Meals cost less in girls' hostels. Electrical appliances like, iron, desert cooler, kettle, heater etc are chargeable at varied costs depending upon the nature of the appliance. Both the Boys' and the Girls' hostels offer single occupancy accommodation. Air conditioned accommodation on double occupancy basis can be made available in the International Students' Hostel which is costlier.

16. Free guidance and counselling sessions will be conducted from 15 to 30 January 2026 from 11:00 to 15:00 Hrs on working days (Monday to Friday). 
